\*\*\*\*If we have a lot of money in our treasury, pay for the meal. We use to but started charging leaders / youth when our funds were low.

\*\*\*\*Don't make leaders pay for it. We give all year long so why can't we be pampered just once? Also, it's just plain boring.

\*\*\*\*Include club awards at the banquet and make it about the kids instead of just about the leaders. \*\*\*\*Make it a family event; keep it less than 90 min (especially if it's during the week); not sure if you will get more people if you make it a weekend just due to family commitments. \*\*\*\*Make it more fun.

\*\*\*\*Talk it up more at club meetings and leaders council.

\*\*\*\*Some of the presentations seem a bit too long. We've also run into they take away the cups and water after the meal is over. The presentations can get a big long, and with no beverage options, we've resorted to bringing out own cooler of water/pop the last few years (we don't do coffee). \*\*\*\*Different food once in a white. Its always the same.

\*\*\*\*Not sure, I am open to ideas, because attendance is definitely down.

\*\*\*\*I liked the year we had a demonstration.

\*\*\*\*Change it altogether

\*\*\*\*Location could move. You could get a club to host. Most awards are made to kids who aren't there – this is a problem. Make it a fundraiser? Make it a community service environment \*\*\*\*Never was clear to me what the clear purpose/mission of the banquet was; clearly defined time/agenda

\*\*\*\*Entertainment should be better prepared. Last year was trip talks and kids were leaving early and not staying to finish the talk

\*\*\*\*Registration needs to be more welcoming and informative to newcomers.

8.) How could we get more clubs to submit for annual club awards? *The results of this question were from those who answered YES to question #1*.

\*\*\*\*Simplify the forms

\*\*\*\*Do we know why they are not? I think leaders are overwhelmed. A mentor program might be part of the answer.

\*\*\*\*Make the forms more computer friendly.

\*\*\*\*Maybe put it in the communicator. Letting everyone know that they're welcome. Not just leaders. \*\*\*\*Let the KIDS know they're available. I'm not sure most kids/clubs even know about them. We didn't know about them in our previous club at all, and that was a very large club.

\*\*\*\*Change the application process to recognizing one significant event /rather than recounting the entire year.

\*\*\*\*Teach them, show them, how to complete, maybe make it simpler

\*\*\*\*This is tough because it falls on the club leader. Sometimes by this time, you are recovering from record books and are exhausted. Holding it in October is better than late September.

\*\*\*\*Make the awards challenge ahead of time. I didn't even know there was an award available to clubs until I started my own club. Next, have the submission be done BY MEMBERS and FUN. How about a video submission? Challenge clubs to have a 3 minute video of why their club should get the award. Show the videos at the banquet. Club does a skit to sell their reason for getting the award. Write a song! What you have now is paperwork created by leaders.

\*\*\*\*Maybe talk to general leaders. My club use to submit every eyar, but I don't know if they still do. Some new leaders/clubs may not know about them???

\*\*\*\*Make sure they all know what they are. But the people who select the winners seem to be somewhat biased.

\*\*\*\*Make it more important to receive an award. None of the kids really understand the plaque thing or even know what the leader usually writes. It's not important for the kids.

\*\*\*\*Make it easier to apply for awards; prizes for winning worth winning.

\*\*\*\*Make it less intense. I think essay format scares people.

\*\*\*\*Make the application well known to all. Have a workshop in fall / winter for adults to help plan, then how to write the application.

9.) What improvements / enhancements could be made to the annual club awards? *The results of this question were from those who answered YES to question #1*.

\*\*\*\*Something the whole club could enjoy not just a plaque.

\*\*\*\*Maybe we start presentations while everyone is eating to keep it shorter.

\*\*\*\*Let outside judges select the winners for impartial treatment to all clubs.

\*\*\*\*Let the clubs know if they are winners prior to the banquet so that the leader can give a push for kids to be there.

\*\*\*\*Again – submission should be fun. A contest. Gee, these kids love to compete that is what they do in 4-H. Give them something worth striving for. Make the submission process fun for the clubs. Help them to create more community and sense of who they are as a club as a result of the award process. Show off the products they created (because the submission process should be a growth experience for the clubs). Use technology as a means of submission – videos, Prezis, music, etc. Show off ALL the submissions and make sure that winners get something that can be shared with their club members – pizza party, free bowling night, etc. Something that the club can really say YES! And then get excited to do it again.

\*\*\*\*Maybe give each club a sort of plaque like the kids get for their discs, and then give the top clubs a disk. But also...maybe there shouldn't be a "top" club. Maybe clubs should be awarded based on their program and participation. So if three clubs all did equally well, and went through the trouble of submitting a form, just recognize them for what they did. I'm not saying everyone should get first place, but instead of first and second place, just have recognition.

\*\*\*\*Selection committee should NOT be members of the leader's council. The form is subjective and there is no objective system to select a club. Maybe club youth officers should have to come and present (like a competition) to win the award...Involve the kids more?

10.) In what other ways could we recognize leaders, clubs, and youth? *The results of this question were from those who answered YES to question #1.* 

\*\*\*\*We should be recognizing those that earned trips.

\*\*\*\*Opportunities at the fair – maybe read those leaders or more years at the same time as the Living Memorial Award.

\*\*\*\*Have a leader or club of the month in the newsletter, so other clubs can see what these clubs are doing and so can the members.

\*\*\*\*I'm not crazy about rewarding the club with things such as ice cream...then the kids that don't participate in anything are also rewarded. With a plaque the club is all recognized, but the kids that helped earn it, know they helped. Not everything has to be for the whole club, maybe we have outstanding leaders? Leader perfect attendance at Leaders Association meetings. Maybe putting pictures and articles in the paper about 4-Her of the month (or leader) it gets the person recognition and also advertises 4-H and gets us out there in the community. (Rewards don't always have to be something they can touch. Or a 4-H Hall of Fame at the fair with pictures of people that do great things in the county).

\*\*\*\*Maybe each club could bring or nominate an outstanding family or youth.

\*\*\*\*What about adding a leader award, committee awards?? We need to do a better job at recognizing the great leaders we have.

\*\*\*\*How about a functional website? Clubs could be offered the opportunity to submit video of their events, projects or community service. Could provide Twitter or Instagram or whatever so kids are connected with phones and pictures. This would up the sense of community and posting/commenting by youth. Shout outs of WOW would build community. Don't know how to do this? Ask a kid. Get these teens in the world they live in. Do not expect them to conform to traditional 4-H rather be innovative and open to change. Let their voices be heard and they will have ownership. Because 4-H is about building leaders. Do not tell young voices that "it can't be done" or "we don't do it that way" because they will just walk away. Not all new ideas will work. However, if the county is never willing to take risk then they will never be creative. Take a chance. Try something new. PLEASE listen to the voices. They have been there in the past, but these voices asking for change get tired. The county needs to listen. Please!

\*\*\*\*Maybe recognize some at the fair – wither during one of the programs under Croix tent or posters?? \*\*\*\*It would be fun to have leader awards – kids could vote on this. I think more youth could be recognized. Choose one outstanding 4-Her from each club.

\*\*\*\*The best opportunity is at the auction Saturday night to have a short ceremony to recognize youth and clubs. Maybe a 10 minute program (at the most). There's nothing like public recognition to elevate someone's self-esteem. It could be fun to also have a large banner printed with winning clubs that are in the buildings or posted in public places at the fair.

\*\*\*\*Communicator (which I think is done already) – really liked that trip winners and graduation seniors were recognized this month.

\*\*\*\*By displaying the awards at the fair for all to see, not just the clubs.

\*\*\*\*The idea of club banners at the fair is great. That's open recognition of the clubs.
