You may also download the department from the fair websitestcroixcofair.com, and make the changes (in different ink colors) on those pages. ## 2016-2017 Volunteer Orientation – Want to become a 4-H leader?

The Wisconsin 4-H program depends upon the more than 20,000 adult volunteers to help youth gain caring, coping, and competency sills. Volunteers are the backbone of the 4-H Youth Development delivery model, and serve as mentors and role models for youth. Training helps volunteers understand the program and their role and provides an opportunity for volunteers to ask questions about the St. Croix County 4-H program. All volunteers who work with 4-H vouth must attend a volunteer orientation workshop and go through the Wisconsin Youth Protection process. The Wisconsin 4-H program is making some changes to the Volunteer Orientation program. The following dates have been set for St. Croix County 4-H adults who wish to become volunteers in the Wisconsin 4-H program:

- October 25, 2016 @ 7:00pm
- o January 10, 2017 @ 7:00pm
- May 2, 2017 @ 7:00pm
- o June 27, 2017 @ 7:00pm

These orientations will be held at the UW-Extension Office / Ag Center in Baldwin and Pre-registration is required. You can register by calling the UW-Extension Office 715-531-1938 or by emailing Heather at

<u>heather.vierling@ces.uwex.edu</u> . Please provide your name, club, contact information and the date of the orientation program you wish to attend. Each orientation will last about 1 ½ hrs. In addition, volunteers are required to fill out 4HOnline enrollment information, acknowledge volunteer expectations, and complete a mandated reporter training online module. Background checks are conducted on new volunteers and repeat every four years for continuing volunteers. Any adults working with 4-H youth other than their own children must comply with these requirements.

All currently enrolled volunteers are encouraged to take this training. It will be tracked in 4HOnline under trainings completed. Any individual or business that has contributed greatly to the 4-H program and is not a 4-H leader is eligible. Please be thinking about people who have helped your club or committee and would be deserving of such recognition. The final selection is made by the 4-H Leaders' Council.

4-H Club Awards are presented in:

- Community Service
- Recreation
- Health/Safety/Environmental Ed

For these club awards, clubs are divided into sizes. The categories for club size are determined by the size of the clubs that have submitted an application. A traveling trophy and a certificate are presented in each category for each size.

If your club has been active in these areas, encourage a committee to put together an application on your club's behalf. You simply need to list your goals and plans for the year and then record the results — what activities were done throughout the year, the number of members taking part in each of the activities, describe your most worthwhile activity and you may also include up to two pages for pictures, newspaper clippings and/or a summary.

## Space Camp: Reach for the Stars Written By: Tyler Sippl

Every year, Wisconsin 4-H sends hundreds of kids to Huntsville, Alabama, for Space Camp. While at Space Camp, you learn about space, participate in simulators, and guide a simulated shuttle into orbit. There are also real rockets on display, including two life-size models of Saturn V rockets, which sent us to the moon.

The simulated shuttle mission is divided into 3 groups, Mission Control, the shuttle crew, and the International Space Station (ISS). Mission Control guides the shuttle, the shuttle crew flips switches and presses buttons, and the ISS performs experiments.

You learn a lot about the past, present, and future of space travel when you go to Space Camp, and it's an experience I would recommend to anyone. This opportunity is open for youth in 6th to 8th grade, and the trip lasts five days.





This document explains the process of a family re-enrolling members and leaders in 4HOnline.

#### **GETTING STARTED**

To get started with the re-enrollment process, log into 4HOnline with your family email and password.

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

#### **RE-ENROLL**

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2014-2015.

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. When you are done, click on **Continue**.

Next is the Additional Information screen when you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click **Continue** when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click **Continue** when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on **Edit** and select the volunteer type. Click on **Update** to save the change. Click on **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on **Edit** for that project and then click on **Delete**. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on **Submit Enrollment**.




