The Quilts of Gee's Bend, I mentioned this book at Spring Council while talking about the quilt project being done by Melodee Sortedahl, and the Honey Doers Club. This is a wonderful (large) photo picture book with narrative about these talented ladies and how they made the world a better place through quilting. I had checked it out at Hudson Library, it was a very inspirational book, much like the lovely quilts shown at Spring Council. The Quilts of Gee's Bend published September 23, 2002, by William Arnett and Alvia Wardlaw (Authors). The women of Gee's Bend, Alabama have developed a distinctive, bold, and sophisticated quilting style based on traditional American and African American quilts.

Before summer slips away, please make plans to visit the county fair and help out in our building. I was at the May Fair last weekend and our building is looking kind of worn out, not sure what we'd be allowed to fix, but maybe we need to look at that item. When the sheep have better digs than we do it's time to do something! 


