

## It's Cold Outside! Preparing Children for Winter

At this time of year, many children enjoy getting out winter clothes, trying on new boots, and adjusting to new schedules and activities. This is an excellent time to talk about how animals get ready for the winter in similar ways. Guiding children toward making healthy choices for cold weather can start with observa?

about the adaptations that animals make to help them weather the cold.

- \* For example, horses grow longer hair in the winter. Long hair helps the horse stay warm. Since people's bodies don't grow long hair like horses, people have to protect themselves from the cold by adding extra layers of warm clothes. Help children learn about fabrics, clothing, and footwear to keep warm when temperatures fall.
- \* Hedgehogs and bears hibernate all winter long. Children might list some activities that can be done indoors during the winter, since time spent outdoors is more limited.
- \* Squirrels hide stores of food in their nests for the winter. How do people preserve food to last through the cold weather season? (examples: canning fruits and vegetables, making jams and jellies, pickling, freezing, and dehydrating) Also discuss cold-weather vegetables such as cabbage, kale, chard, and turnips.

Encourage children to think of other ways that animals get ready for winter and ways that their families prepare for the cold. Our goal is to keep the children thinking of healthy habits during the change in the season!

## Easy, Healthy, Hot Chocolate for Kids

### **Ingredients:**

- 2 cups almond milk (or your milk of choice)
- 2 Tbsp. cocoa powder
- 2 Tbsp. honey or maple syrup\*
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract

### **Directions:**

Warm the almond milk in a small saucepan, then whisk in the cocoa powder, honey, and vanilla extract. Whisk well to remove any lumps from the cocoa. Serve warm.

# Mason Jar Snow Globes

As the weather changes, some bird species migrate away, others visit your area while migrating through and still others stay close to home to stick out the winter months. With this project, you can help feed local and traveling birds any time of year.

### **Supplies Needed:**

Mason Jar Hot Glue Gun with Glue Sticks Fake Tree, Pine Cone, Figurines, etc. Fake Snow Optional: Glitter Water or Glycerin



### **Instructions:**

Hot glue your fake tree or object to the bottom of the mason jar lid.

Hot glue a small amount of snow to the mason jar lid around your tree so you cant see the lid anymore. Fill the bottom 1/2 inch of your mason jar with snow.

Set your lid with the tree on it inside your mason jar and fasten the mason jar screw on lid. Tip the jar upside down to make it snow.

### **Other ideas:**

Put a small amount of glitter in the jar with your snow to make it look like the snow is glistening. You can add water or Glycerin to the jar to make the snow move slowly through the jar.

### **Questions You Can Ask Youth:**

- 1.) How can we get the snow to float down to the bottom of the glass instead of just falling?
- 2.) What else could I use to make it look like snow falling?
- 3.) What other objects could I put in the jar?

### **Cloverbuds & their Grandparents: Bringing the Generations Togethe** By: James S Bates (OSU Extension—Family Wellness)

Involving the grandparents of Cloverbuds can be an enriching and beneficial experience. Not only do grandparents have life experience, talents, and knowledge to share with grandchildren, but they too benefit from participating in activities with grandchildren. In truth, involvement in Cloverbud 4-H has the potential to build stronger individuals and families.

Research on grandparent-grandchild relationships is very clear: Grandparents enjoy, learn from, and feel better when they are engaged in meaningful activities with their grandchildren. It makes sense, and most people have seen grandparents "light up" when they get the opportunity to spend time with their grandchildren. Grandchildren teach grandparents not only about technology but also about things they learn at school or in their extracurricular activities. My research has found that grandfathers who participate in a variety of activities with their grandchildren have fewer feelings of sadness and depression and increased feelings of happiness.

Grandparents are motivated to care for and nurture the next generation. A theorist named Erik Erikson referred to this innate motivation as *generativity*. The root of this word *generate*, which suggests that grandparents want to create, share, foster, and guide. And when it comes to the people they love, grandparents want to share with grandchildren their knowledge, wisdom, talents, and resources to help them be successful in life.

Grandparents can be included in Cloverbud 4-H and demonstrate generativity in the following ways:

- Tell stories about the family's history, ancestors, how things used to be "... back in my day"
- Teach skills related to sewing, mechanical things, cooking, woodworking, art, music, sports, and other interests of the grandparent
- Encourage with kind words and show love with physical affection
- Spend time doing leisure activities that both will find enjoyable
