Dear 4-H Families,

As we create this newsletter, we are diving into the new year of 2018. I hope you have found value through your 4-H participation and I look forward to seeing you at activities during the upcoming year.

Sometimes people ask, "Does participation in 4-H make a difference?" Research studies provide specific evidence about the value of the 4-H experience for young people. In an article written by Cathann Kress, vice president for agricultural administration and dean of the College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences at Ohio State University, she stated, "Young people who participate in 4-H Clubs do better in school, are more motivated to help others, and are developing skills in leadership, public speaking, self-esteem, communication and planning, and are making lasting friendships."

A ten-year longitudinal study done by Tuffs University comparing 4-H youth to non 4-H youth concluded the following about 4-H youth:

- 4X more likely to give back to their communities
- 2X more likely to make healthier choices
- 2X more likely to participate in STEM activities
- 3X more likely to be physically active
- 2X more likely to get better grades in school
- 2X more likely to report high school engagement
- 2X more likely to have higher levels of positive youth development skills
- 5X more likely to graduate college
- 2X more likely to pursue a career in science, engineering or computer technology

As we begin the new 4-H year, I would like to encourage all youth, leaders, and parents to take an active part with their 4-H club this year. I would challenge you to try new things: projects, countywide activities, 4-H camp, etc. 4-H is truly making a difference in the lives of the youth in our program, but it is up to all of us to continue to engage and encourage youth. I look forward to a great 2018!

4-H Volunteer (VIP Training) - Want to become a 4-H leader?

The Wisconsin 4-H program depends upon the more than 20,000 adult volunteers to help youth gain sills. Volunteers are the backbone of the 4-H Youth Development delivery model, and serve as mentors for youth. Training helps volunteers understand the program and their role and provides an opportunity to ask questions about the St. Croix County 4-H program. All volunteers who work with 4-H youth must attend a volunteer orientation workshop and go through the Wisconsin Youth Protection process.

These orientations will be held at the UW-Extension Office / Ag Center in Baldwin and Pre-registration is required. Please provide your name, club, contact information and the date of the orientation program you wish to attend. Each orientation will last about 1 ½ hrs. In addition. volunteers are required to fill out 4HOnline enrollment information, acknowledge volunteer expectations, and complete a mandated reporter training online module. Background checks are conducted on new volunteers and repeat every four years for continuing volunteers. Any adults working with 4-H youth other than their own children must comply with these requirements.

Mini Talent Explosion

Saturday, April 7 Location: TBD

Mini Talent Explosion

Music and Drama will be judged in the morning. Speaking and demonstrations will be judged in the late morning and early afternoon.

Mini Drama/Skits: Includes 2 or more actors, are simple dramas that can be performed anywhere and are no more than 10 minutes. The top mini drama/skit is eligible to go to the State Fair.

New Personal Drama/Skit: These are simple one person dramas/monolgues that can be performed anywhere and are no more than 10 minutes. The top personal drama/skit is eligible to go to the State Fair.

Music: Includes 2 or more members, can include vocal, instrumental, and dance. The top music performance is eligible to go to the State Fair. Should be no more than 20 minutes in length including setup and take down.

Original Speech: Must be developed by the member who is presenting it. There are 5 age categories.

Cloverbuds --recite the 4-H Pledge as a club group. If your club only has 1 Cloverbud who would like to participate, we can add them in with another club.

Junior (grades 3-5)-- up to 6 minutes Intermediate (grades 6-8)-- up to 8 minutes Senior (grades 9-13)-- up to 8 minutes

Interpretive Reading: Participants select a favorite poem, prose, or part of a story and "read" it aloud for the audience. Memorization is not required. There are two categories for interpretive reading, individual and dynamic duo, which is a team of 2 members. There are 4 age divisions for each category.

Cloverbuds -- up to 4 minutes Junior (grades 3-5)-- up to 6 minutes Intermediate (grades 6-8)-- up to 8 minutes Senior (grades 9-13)-- up to 8 minutes

Illustrated Talk: An illustrated talk is another means of sharing information and educating an audience about a specific subject. It is an oral presentation in which the member uses posters/illustrations or objects to emphasize/illustrate specific points in the speech. A member does not actually make or

demonstrate how to do something in an illustrated talk. This is a fair entry, so regular fair ribbons are used and premiums are earned, intermediate and seniors could be chosen to go to the State Fair. If you enter an illustrated talk, remember to sign up for demonstrations & communications on your fair enrollment in May. There are two categories for illustrated talks individual and team (2 members). There are 3 age divisions for each category.

Junior (grades 3-5)--4-7 minute talk Intermediate (grades 6-8)--5-8 minute talk Senior (grades 9-13)--5-8 minute talk

Demonstrations: Members show the audience how to make or do something, like how to make ants on a log or sew on a button. This is a fair entry, so regular fair ribbons are used and premiums are earned, intermediate and seniors could be chosen to go to the State Fair. If you enter in the demonstration contest, remember to sign up for demonstrations & communications on your fair enrollment in May. There are two categories for demonstrations individual and team (2 members). There are 3 age divisions for each category.

Junior (grades 3-5)--4-7 minute demonstration Intermediate (grades 6-8)--5-8 minute demo. Senior (grades 9-13)--5-8 minute demonstration

St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Scholarships & Key Award

Applications due April 6

There are eight (8) scholarships available. A member may receive only one scholarship. Members pursuing a degree in nursing may also want to apply for the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan, which has a separate application.

Any St. Croix County 4-H member who is a graduating high school senior or has graduated from high school with a GPA of 2.5 or above is eligible.

General Selection Criteria:

- Active in all areas or 4-H involvement
- Demonstrated leadership beyond local club level
- Sense of direction in furthering education
- 2.5 grade average

Five scholarships are for any post high school education. One scholarship is for a teaching related field and one for study in a health field. The Forgivable Loan is for study in nursing.

The 4-H Horse Project \$250 Scholarship -

Financial support for any field of study. To a graduated senior who has been in good standing with the horse project for 3 years.

WI 4-H Key Award - 4-H Key Award is the highest 4-H recognition you can receive. 4-H Key Award applicants must have consistent 4-H growth, be in 10th grade or older, must have completed at least 3 years of 4-H and 1 year of youth leadership and contributed to service to their club, community, and county.

Where: Presented at the St. Croix County Fair

When: July 2018

Eligibility: Must be in the 10th – 13th grade

Host Families Sought for 4H International Programs

Local families are needed to host International exchange students, ages 12 to 18, for four weeks this summer as part of an exchange program sponsored by 4-H.

The program is open to 4-H & Non- 4-H families living in Wisconsin with children between the ages of 10 and 18. Families without children in this age range will be considered as hosts for the adult chaperones for two-week periods. You only need a willingness to share your home and your world. There is no need to know the language. The students have all studied English and are anxious to use it.

The 4-H States Exchange program is one of the largest exchange programs in the world. Since it began in 1972, some 45,000 students have stayed with families in 51 states and provinces including Wisconsin and more than 7,000 American students

have made reciprocal visits to Japan & other participating countries. "The program gives host families a chance to share their culture, friendship and family life with an exchange student and at the same time learn about Japanese or South Korean everyday life," said Kay Hobler, retired Wisconsin 4-H Outreach Specialist. "The home-stays only last a month during summer vacation, but the effects last a lifetime."

State Fair Dairy Promotion Board Scholarships Available

The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board is offering \$1,000 scholarships to students that will be third or fourth-year college students during the 2018-2019 academic year. Additional \$1,000 scholarships will be offered to high school seniors that will be first-year college students during the 2018-2019 academic year. Students studying in a two-year program are also encourage to apply. Any Wisconsin resident who will enroll or is currently enrolled as a full-time student in a two or four-year Wisconsin school or short course program and is pursuing a dairy-related or food science degree is eligible for scholarship consideration. Previous recipients are not eligible to apply.

All applicants are required to submit an application electronically no later than March 23, 2018. Save application as Last Name, First Name and e-mail to katzman@idcnet.com using the subject – Wisconsin State Fair Diary Promotion Board Scholarship Application. Attach your transcript as a separate document. Hand-written applications will NOT be accepted. Mail applications/transcripts will NOT be accepted.

Applicants will be evaluated on involvement and leadership in dairy-related activities, scholastic achievement, and career objectives. Finalists will be interviewed, with the recipients to be recognized at both the Dairyland Youth Celebration and Blue Ribbon Cheese & Butter Auction during the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair. Please note that in order for continued consideration, students that qualify for an

interview must be available on the interview date selected during business hours.

Scholarship recipients must continue enrollment in the suggested curriculum and maintain an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher or forfeit scholarship monies. Scholarships will be awarded at the completion of the first semester and at the time the Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board has received a copy of registration for the second semester and a current transcript.

Words of 4-H Wisdom By Matthew Harle

4-H creates a positive learning environment for kids to build life skills through hands-on learning. The 4-H program results in kids who are empowered with the skills to lead for a lifetime.

When I joined 4-H as a first grader, I really didn't know what 4-H was about or what to expect as a 4-H member. Now, in my 10th year with the 4-H program, I have the experience and knowledge to reflect on how 4-H has developed me as an individual and how it can help in your development.

You can only get the benefits out if you put the effort in. Although 4-H includes agriculture, there are many other fun and educationally challenging activities including science, engineering, technology, natural resources, and cultural arts. 4-H promotes community service, recreation, health and safety, and citizenship by getting youth involved in activities: picking up trash along the roadside, playing bingo with shut-ins, making cookie boxes for the homeless, collecting food shelf donations, recycling to protect the environment, and playing 4-H softball. The more 4-H activities you actively participate in, the greater the opportunities for growth.

And, as you invest more time into 4-H activities, the benefits begin to multiply. Grow confidence as you develop your speaking skills, in both group settings and one-on-one interactions. Develop leadership skills as 4-H club meetings are generally run by the members themselves. Create new

friendships with peers and adult leaders by participating in meetings, events and activities including 4-H camps, trips, and fairs on the club, county, and state levels. Explore projects that can lead to a future career. However, it is important to note that the benefits of 4-H do not happen overnight – they are developed over time.

Brochures to promote 4-H say "True leaders are young people who have confidence; know how to work well with others; can endure through challenges; and will stick with a job until it gets done. In 4-H, we believe true leaders aren't born – they're grown." Those brochures are just a piece of paper. However, I am the real thing – a true example of how 4-H has influenced development to create positive outcomes. I challenge you to create your own example by **being involved in 4-H!**
