St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Scholarships & Key Award Applications due April 6

The St. Croix County 4-H Leaders' Association and current sponsors offer 5 different scholarships and one (1) forgivable loan. To be considered for a scholarship or forgivable loan, applications must be received by the UW-Extension Office no later than April 6, 2018; late applications will not be considered. St. Croix County 4-H Scholarships are awarded to 4-H members based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance and future educational goals. To be eligible for a scholarship or forgivable loan you must be currently enrolled as a St. Croix County 4-H member; be a member in good standing, have a grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2018-2019 academic school year.

FORGIVEABLE LOAN Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan

Upon completion of first semester. To receive the loan payment, the recipient must submit a copy of their transcript to the UW-Extension Office along with a written acknowledgement to the family sponsoring the loan in a stamped, addressed envelope.

The Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan is for \$250.00 for study in the nursing field. The loan is renewable with a yearly application. To be eligible to receive the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan you must:

- 1.) Be a St. Croix County 4-Her or Alumni
- 2.) Have a current GPA minimum of 2.5
- 3.) Enter a field of nursing study
- 4.) Complete the proper application process:
 - First time applicants must submit this cover letter, the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan Application, a recommendation from a 4-H club leader and a current transcript.
 - Reapplying applicants must submit this cover letter along with a brief statement describing educational progress and updating any changes in educational goals.
- 5.) Complete 2 4 years of nursing study or training. After graduation the recipient is required to submit a copy of the graduation

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certificate to the UW-Extension Office, upon which the loan will be forgiven.

A member may apply for both the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan and a St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Association Scholarship.

KEY AWARD

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community.

To be eligible, candidates for this award must be at least in 9th grade or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

Selection is based on an evaluation of the candidate's total 4-H record (membership, projects, activities, leadership, personal development and county 4-H and community involvement.).

Mini Talent Explosion

Music and Drama will be judged in the morning. Speaking and demonstrations will be judged in the late morning and early afternoon.

Mini Drama/Skits: Includes 2 or more actors, are simple dramas that can be performed anywhere and are no more than 10 minutes. The top mini drama/skit is eligible to go to the State Fair.

*****New*** Personal Drama/Skit:** These are simple one person dramas/monolgues that can be performed anywhere and are no more than 10 minutes. The top personal drama/skit is eligible to go to the State Fair.

Music: Includes 2 or more members, can include vocal, instrumental, and dance. The top music performance is eligible to go to the State Fair. Should be no more than 20 minutes in length including setup and take down.

Original Speech: Must be developed by the member who is presenting it. There are 5 age categories.

Cloverbuds --recite the 4-H Pledge as a club. If your club only has 1 Cloverbud who would like to participate, we can add them in with another club.

Junior (grades 3-5) -- up to 6 minutes Intermediate (grades 6-8) -- up to 8 minutes Senior (grades 9-13) -- up to 8 minutes

Interpretive Reading: Participants select a favorite poem, prose, or part of a story and "read" it aloud for the audience. Memorization is not required. There are two categories for interpretive reading, individual and dynamic duo, which is a team of 2 members. There are 4 age divisions for each category.

Cloverbuds -- up to 4 minutes Junior (grades 3-5) -- up to 6 minutes Intermediate (grades 6-8) -- up to 8 minutes Senior (grades 9-13) -- up to 8 minutes

Illustrated Talk: An illustrated talk is another means of sharing information and educating an audience about a specific subject. It is an oral presentation in which the member uses posters/illustrations or objects to emphasize/illustrate specific points in the speech. A member does not actually make or demonstrate how to do something in an illustrated talk. This is a fair entry, so regular fair ribbons are used and premiums are earned, intermediate and seniors could be chosen to go to the State Fair. If you enter an illustrated talk, remember to sign up for demonstrations & communications on your fair enrollment. There are two categories for illustrated talks individual and team (2 members). There are 3 age divisions for each category.

Junior (grades 3-5)--4-7 minute talk Intermediate (grades 6-8)--5-8 minute talk Senior (grades 9-13)--5-8 minute talk

Demonstrations: Members show the audience how to make or do something. This is a fair entry, so regular fair ribbons are used and premiums are earned, intermediate and seniors could be chosen to go to the State Fair. If you enter in the demonstration contest, remember to sign up for demonstrations & communications on your fair enrollment in May. There are two categories for demonstrations individual and team (2 members). There are 3 age divisions for each category.

Junior (grades 3-5)--4-7 minute demonstration Intermediate (grades 6-8)--5-8 minute demo. Senior (grades 9-13)--5-8 minute demonstration

CSI Investigation - Want to become a real life detective? Youth will collect evidence, analysis of soil and mineral samples, analysis of fabric, fiber, and blood samples, and learn fingerprint and hair analysis in order to solve the crime.

Opportunity for Hosting International Students 2018

Wisconsin 4-H is again hosting young people from Japan, Korea, Mexico and Costa Rica for 1 month in the summer of 2018. Hosting one of these students is a unique and wonderful opportunity to learn the differences and similarities of another culture, and gain life-long friendships.

Host families are asked to fill out an application form listing all family members and their interests. Hosts welcome the international students into their homes and families for 1 month, including them in family activities and chores. There are no special trips/activities that are required for hosting. Our exchange students want to experience American family life and hear/speak English. The students will be in the U.S. July – August; they are 12 - 17 years of age.

Families pick the students up and return them to Madison, WI. You can carpool, or even have another family pick up your child and meet you if necessary.

State Fair Qualification -Demonstrations

There are two ways to qualify to participate at the Wisconsin State Fair in Demonstrations.

1) Attend the County Mini-Talent Explosion for judging and receive recommendation for state fair attendance

2) Members can be recommended by their club general leaders as state fair participants. Members <u>MUST demonstrate at the club level</u> and receive recommendation by the general leader <u>by June 1 of</u> <u>that calendar year</u>. General leaders must provide feedback on the <u>demonstration criteria worksheet</u> currently used at the county judging event and contact the office by the deadline to indicate their approval for your demonstration to move onto the state fair competition.

Please be advised that State Fair participation is the responsibility of the member which includes travel expenses and arrangements to and from the event. Cost of staying at the Tommy Thompson Youth Center (approximately \$35/night and includes three meals in the cafeteria) is also the responsibility of the member. State fair participation for demonstrations varies from 2-3 nights at the state fair and includes an educational curriculum on public speaking. Members demonstrate a total of three times over three days.

The demonstration opportunity at the Wisconsin State Fair has been known to be an incredible experience for the youth from St. Croix County. General leaders should contact the office to request the judging criteria form. Questions can be directed to DeAnn Hammer at <u>deannhammer@gmail.com</u>.

Tractor Safety

Tractor Safety June 18-21 8:00am – 3:00 pm St. Croix Central High School Ag Department

To become knowledgeable in operating Ag equipment. If you want to be able to drive a tractor on the road or for someone besides your parents you need to take this class. Farm jobs, nursery jobs, anything with a tractor requires this permit. Prevent agriculture accidents from occurring. Complete a 28-hour class and pass both a written and driving test. This is a practical hands-on and academic week. All youth ages 12 and older working on any farm or business other than their parents. This is a Federal Employment Certificate for students 14 and older.

The cost for this class is \$30.00 payable on June 18 for each student. This fee covers insurance, books, tractors, fuel and facilities. Schools sending four or more students without a participating instructor will be charged \$200 to cover the need to pay for a trained instructor. This is payable to SCC FFA. You MUST have parental permission slips signed and returned on Monday morning (June 18) to drive tractors. The slips will be available on the first day of class. You will need to find your own transportation to St. Croix Central High School on your own. Lunch will be eaten in Baldwin (Dairy Queen, Subway or McDonalds) so bring money or a sack lunch.

Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range.

All leaders must first complete one 12-hour workshop to be certified. After that, you may be eligible to attend a Saturday, eight-hour range workshop to receive an additional discipline certification. If three years lapse before adding an additional certification, the full 12-hour certification must be repeated. Only one certification may be obtained at any one certification workshop.

All certification workshops are 6PM to 10PM on Friday and 8AM to 5:00PM Saturday. You must participate in all required hours to receive your certification. Those attending for the first time must complete the Friday and Saturday sessions. Those returning for an additional certification need only attend their Saturday range workshop providing three (3) years has not lapsed since attending the Friday session.

COOL for Youth Exhibitors Country of Origin Labeling (Sheep and Goats)

Basic premise of COOL: this is a government USDA rule that provides consumers with information of where their food originated. It is another step to protect the American food supply, and give choices to consumers. This is not USDA required for swine but is for sheep and goats and the SCLC IS REQUIRING them for all species.

Producers (youth exhibitors) need to provide documentation of the origin of their project animal. You do not need to bring additional information to the first weigh-in. (**Remember**, if you purchased your animals from out of state, you need to bring along the import data that is required by DATCP.)

Animal Health Exhibition Update

<u>Swine:</u>

Wisconsin does not currently have specific requirements for movement of swine within the state of Wisconsin except to fairs, shows or exhibitions. Official individual ID, a certificate of veterinarian inspection (CVI) and an import permit are not required. For animals traveling to a fair, show, or exhibition, please visit our Fairs, Shows, and other Special Events page:

https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/FairsS howsSpecialEvents.aspx.

Swine from outside Wisconsin need a certificate of veterinary inspection that includes the following: official identification is not required unless required by individual fair/exhibitions/shows. Statement that vet has inspected the entire herd of origin within the past 30 days before the show with no apparent disease. Terminal shows, no testing is required. For nonterminal shows testing for Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Virus (PRRS) and Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease (SECD) is required as follows: - If negative tests of herd of origin within 90 days prior to movement, pigs can move to fairs or shows as noted above. Documentation of the negative test results must be made available upon request. Test results, test type, and date of testing need to be included on the CVI.

- If positive tests for either PRRS or SECD of herd of origin within 90 days prior to movement, the herd will be quarantined until a herd plan is established and approved. Swine may be able to move to the fair or show in accordance with the herd plan. Include the test results, test type, date of testing an, and herd plan number on the CVI. - The herd of origin refers to the current herd with the current owner. The current herd of origin will be required to have had a test within 90 days of movement.

Acceptable methods of ID for swine are:

- USDA ear tag number
- USDA 840 button ear tag
- Ear notch
- A tattoo or anear tag with the premises identification number and a unique identifier
- A microchip
- Breed association tattoo

Beef:

Cattle from within Wisconsin have no requirements for tests or health documents.

Cattle from outside Wisconsin must:

- Be accompanied by certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) documenting official animal ID and all required tests and certifications
- Have at least one form of official individual ID (including steers)
- Meet all of Wisconsin's normal requirements for import (see <u>http://datcp.wi.gov/Animals/Animal_Movement/</u> Cattle Bison)

Acceptable animal IDs for all cattle from outside Wisconsin

- USDA metal ear tag number that is part of the National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) (starts with state 2-digit code, also known as "brite" tag)
- USDA animal identification number tag 15digit number starting with 840
- Manufacturer-coded RFID tag 15-digit number with the first three digits beginning with 9 (accepted as ID when applied before March 11, 2015)
- American ID tab –12-digit number prefaced with "USA"
- Other ID approved by DATCP

Burcellosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin

• There are no requirements for brucellosis testing or vaccination.

Tuberculosis requirements for cattle from outside Wisconsin

Neutered sheep or goats under 12 months old

• Cannot have been exposed to scrapie if they are sexually intact.

Sheep and goats from outside Wisconsin:

 Need Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) with Official Identification of the animal written on the CVI. See <u>https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Service</u> <u>s/SheepGoatMovement.aspx</u> page for Official Identification options.

Required:

• Certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) with complete physical origin and destination address

- Official identification written on the CVI (one of the following):
 - Scrapie tag (flock or serial)
 - Official USDA RFID 840 tag (15-digit number beginning with "840")
 - Complete and legible breed association or registration tattoo, accompanied by registration papers in owner's name
 - Tattoo with both a USDA assigned flock number and a unique individual ID number
 - USDA-approved implanted microchips when implanted in the animal and either registered by a breed association with the number recorded by the registry on the registration certificate accompanying the animal, or for sheep participating in the Scrapie Flock Certification Program
- <u>Import permits</u> for goats from Michigan's Modified Accredited (MA) Zone (see below) and sheep or goats that are rodeo stock or part of a multi-species menagerie, such as a petting zoo
- If there is a current vesicular stomatitis diagnosis or quarantine in the state of origin, effective May 30, 2014, Wisconsin no longer requires a permit or special statements.

Goats from Michigan's Modified Accredited

Zone: Need import permits, and must return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CFI that they will be doing do.

- TB testing and requirement:
- Need negative whole-herd TB tests within 12 months before arrival in Wisconsin
- Need negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering Wisconsin
- Quarantined on arrival and require TB test between 60 and 90 days after arrival
- Must return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so
- No eligible to be sold at consignment sale or auction
- An import permit is required

NEW FOR 2018! Wisconsin State Fair is pleased to announce implementation of a new national certification program available for youth. Completion of this informative and educational program, "Youth for the Quality Care of Animals" (YQCA), will be required for all youth who exhibit animal projects (Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine) at the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows. This interactive program will reinforce current animal industry best practices and awareness of critically important animal messaging. This special program features interspecies information designed to supplement project education for Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Routry, Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine exhibitors.

YQCA was developed and funded by national livestock industry professionals, extension specialists and livestock show managers. YQCA certification is rapidly being endorsed and implemented for exhibitors at Fairs and animal exhibitions across the country. It replaces the National Pork Board's Youth Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) program and Wisconsin's Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) program.

Course content includes an age appropriate module from each of the following program areas:

- Animal Welfare (basic needs, proper animal handling, biosecurity, etc.).
- Food Safety (medications, medicated feeds, withdrawal times, avoiding residue, etc.).
- Character Education (ethics, goal setting, career exploration, etc.).

YQCA certification is offered in two formats to meet varied learning styles and active schedules:

Online – Fee: \$12/exhibitor/year Available 24/7 at www.yqca.org

-OR-

 Face-to-Face/Trainer-Led – Fee: \$3/exhibitor/year To find a list of face-to-face/trainer-led sessions in Wisconsin, create an account on <u>www.yqca.org</u>. Under the appropriate age in "Course List" choose "Instructor-Led Training". A drop down box will list all current available options for Wisconsin.

Both certification types (Online and Face-to-Face) must be paid online with a credit card. The nominal course fees (\$12/\$3) ensures the course content/learning platform stays current.

Annual certification should take approximately 60 minutes. After viewing each module, the exhibitor must successfully pass a quiz which demonstrates content mastery. Youth wishing to exhibit in the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows <u>must</u> provide his/her YQCA certification number when entering by the entry deadline on <u>June 6, 2018</u>. Youth who do not provide a YQCA certification number, or did not pass the YQCA modules for the current calendar year will not be eligible to participate in the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows.
