St. Croix County Fair—Cloverbuds

General Rules:

1.) All Cloverbud entries will be conference judged. Conference judging will be from 12pm—7:30pm on entry day of the fair, July 18. Members are to pick up their entry tags from the Junior Fair Office and go to the judging area.

2.) All posters/pictures/drawings must be on tag board either 14" x 22" or 9" x 12" (pictures or drawings may be on paper and mounted on tag board.

3.) Food exhibits must consist of three items on a plate. Collection exhibit (leaves, flowers, seed, etc.) must consist of five items. Display bases (cardboard, plywood, plastic, etc.) must by no larger than 20" x 20". Cloverbuds may participate in the Clothing Revue and the Foods Revue which will not count toward the 5 or 3 exhibits.

Easy Breakfast Casserole Muffins

Ingredients:

3-4 pieces of whole wheat bread, torn into small pieces (enough to fill muffin tines almost to the top)

- 3-4 slices of deli ham
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 8 eggs
- 1 cup milk
- 2 teaspoons ground mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon ground pepper

Dried Parsley



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease muffin tins well. Drop bread pieces evenly in muffin tins until they come about 2/3 of the way up the tin. Sprinkle ham pieces evenly in each tine. Sprinkle cheese evenly in each tin. Whisk together eggs, milk, ground mustard and pepper. Pour egg mixture evenly in each muffin tin. Sprinkle a little dried Parsley on the top of each. Bake 15-18 minutes or until golden brown on top and cooked through the middle.

Supplies Needed:

Examples of pop up books or greeting cards Plain white paper Pencils and crayons, colored pencils or markers Piece of heavy cardstock per child Selection of construction paper and additional decorative paper—scrapbooking paper, wrapping paper, etc. Scissors Glue sticks



Instructions:


- Give each child a piece of paper and pencil and have them plan their design first. Tell them to sketch some ideas and write a short story. Allow about 5 minutes. As they finish, ask them to share their ideas and let them pick out paper for their pop-up card.
- Demonstrate making the card step by step:
 - Fold cardstock in half, short sides toghether. Cut two equal slits in the folded edge.
 - Push the section between slits out so it folds in and "pops up" when opened.
 - -Glue the pop-up card inside the construction paper cover.
 - Decorate your card. Cut out paper shapes and glue to the pop-up. Add drawings and messages. Don't for get to sign your name.

Questions You Can Ask Youth:

- 1.) Who do you want to send a card to? Why?
- 2.) What kind of card will you send them?

Share / Reflect:

Would you do anything different? How do you think this person will feel when they receive your card?



Inspire Children to LOVE Books and Words by Reading Together Every Day

When you read with your child—even before they can use words you're helping them learn and making them happier too! Research shows that reading with your kids every day from birth helps build their brains, grow their vocabulary, and develop a love of learning. Reading at home is also essential for learning to read and write once your child begins school.

Starting at infancy, babies should be read to so that they get used to hearing language, bond with their caregivers, and develop their own love of books and reading. Reading with infants and toddlers helps them develop a longer attention span, a larger vocabulary, an eagerness to read, the ability to predict a storyline, and book handling skills, all of which will help with learning to read later.

Making book-sharing a part of your daily routine will help your child include reading as part of his/her daily life when they are older. Children who become independent readers regularly demonstrate higher academic achievement in all subject areas over their lifetime.

Below are some helpful tips when reading to young children:

- Read a book everyday
- Cuddle with your child when reading
- Point to the pictures, letters, numbers and words in the book
- Ask them to read the story with you or to you
- Ask open ended questions
- Let your child turn the pages
- Be interactive, read with fun in your voice
- Know when to stop



4-H Conference Judging

What is 4–H conference judging?

A 4-H member sits down with the judge at the fair and talks with them about their 4-H exhibit. Judges will award ribbons and placings according to the exhibitor's knowledge about the exhibit and the quality of the exhibit.

How do you prepare for conference judging?

Before the county fair, sit down and answer the following questions about your exhibit (s). It's okay to have a parent or brother / sister help you and its good practice! Be sure to practice talking loudly and clearly so you can be understood.

What will the judge ask?

What is your name? How many years have you been in 4-H? What club do you belong to? Next the judge will ask you a series of questions about your exhibit.

Cloverbud 4-H Members

4-Her's who are enrolled in the Cloverbud Project will go through the same experience as older 4-H members, so they should also prepare to talk to a judge about their exhibit. One difference between the two is that Cloverbud members will not be asked nearly as many questions nor will they be expected to know as much as an older 4-H member. Think of Cloverbud judging as simply having a conversation with an adult; there is no competition involved.
