Tractor Safety

June 18-21 8:00am - 3:00 pm

St. Croix Central High School Ag Department

To become knowledgeable in operating Ag equipment. If you want to be able to drive a tractor on the road or for someone besides your parents you need to take this class. Farm jobs, nursery jobs, anything with a tractor requires this permit. Prevent agriculture accidents from occurring.

Complete a 28-hour class and pass both a written and driving test. This is a practical hands-on and academic week. All youth ages 12 and older working on any farm or business other than their parents. This is a Federal Employment Certificate for students 14 and older.

The cost for this class is \$30.00 payable on June 18 for each student. This fee covers insurance, books, tractors, fuel and facilities. Schools sending four or more students without a participating instructor will be charged \$200 to cover the need to pay for a trained instructor. This is payable to SCC FFA. You MUST have parental permission slips signed and returned on Monday morning (June 18) to drive tractors. The slips will be available on the first day of class. You will need to find your own transportation to St. Croix Central High School on your own. Lunch will

be eaten in Baldwin (Dairy Queen, Subway or McDonalds) so bring money or a sack lunch.

Due to complications with the start of the YQCA training the St. Croix County Livestock Committee has decided to allow the exhibitors the option of doing the YQCA training online (cost \$12) or in person YQCA training in person in another county (cost \$3) or attending another clinic.

St. Croix County Livestock Exhibitors

Over the next few months and weeks *PLEASE* watch your emails, newsletter and email blasts. We have a lot going on and want to keep you informed.

The "Pig Palace" fund has been set up with the St. Croix County Fair Board. The St. Croix Livestock Committee is coming up with ways to have participants help raise this money. Again this year, ALL Livestock Members (Beef, Sheep, Swine & Goat) may donate a portion of their auction check to the barn fund (ANY amount will be appreciated). This will be totally optional, but we hope that members will find this is a great way to participate for the future of a new barn.

4-H Animal Projects Subject to Premises ID Rules

Even if it's only one horse or one chicken, 4-H members who raise and show livestock are subject to the rules about "premise registration." The Wisconsin Premises Registration Act requires anyone who keeps, houses, or co-mingles livestock to register their premises effective November 1, 2005. Those premises currently licensed by the Department must register as part of their annual license renewal date. Premises registration is not aimed solely at traditional

large scale agriculture. A premise may house many

animals or a single animal. It doesn't matter if the animals are for sale or not. If they house any of the listed species they are included:

Who must register

- The property owner, livestock owner, livestock caretaker, or other person involved in the livestock operation must register facilities not licensed by DATCP. If two or more people keep livestock on the same premises, one registration covers all.
- Current DATCP licensees must register their licensed livestock premises (dairy, deer and fish farms; animal markets, dealers and truckers; slaughter and rendering plants; and equine quarantine facilities).

How to register

- Register online: <u>www.wiid.org</u>, phone WLIC at 888-808-1910, or use paper forms available from DATCP or WLIC.
- DATCP will send renewals every three years.
 Renewals submitted between January 1, 2016
 and December 31, 2018 will expire on July 31, 2019.
- Information required:
 - o Legal name, trade name, address, phone.
 - o Primary premises & up to 3 secondary locations.
 - Name & phone of contact person who has knowledge of livestock movements to and from premises.
 - Type of operation & Type of livestock.
- Registrants will receive a unique premises registration number printed on a convenient plastic card, which can be carried in a wallet or placed in a file.



At 1 p.m. we need additional volunteers, to begin to put displays together and in position for entry day.





<u>NEW FOR 2018!</u> Wisconsin State Fair is pleased to announce implementation of a new national certification program available for youth. Completion of this informative and educational program, "Youth for the Quality Care of Animals" (YQCA), will be required for all youth who exhibit animal projects (Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine) at the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows. This interactive program will reinforce current animal industry best practices and awareness of critically important animal messaging. This special program features interspecies information designed to supplement project education for Beef, Dairy, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, and Swine exhibitors.

YQCA was developed and funded by national livestock industry professionals, extension specialists and livestock show managers. YQCA certification is rapidly being endorsed and implemented for exhibitors at Fairs and animal exhibitions across the country. It replaces the National Pork Board's Youth Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) program and Wisconsin's Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) program.

Course content includes an age appropriate module from each of the following program areas:

- Animal Welfare (basic needs, proper animal handling, biosecurity, etc.).
- Food Safety (medications, medicated feeds, withdrawal times, avoiding residue, etc.).
- Character Education (ethics, goal setting, career exploration, etc.).

YQCA certification is offered in two formats to meet varied learning styles and active schedules:

Online – Fee: \$12/exhibitor/year Available 24/7 at www.ygca.org

-OR-

Face-to-Face/Trainer-Led – Fee: \$3/exhibitor/year
 To find a list of face-to-face/trainer-led sessions in Wisconsin, create an account on www.yqca.org.
 Under the appropriate age in "Course List" choose "Instructor-Led Training". A drop down box will list all current available options for Wisconsin.

Both certification types (Online and Face-to-Face) must be paid online with a credit card. The nominal course fees (\$12/\$3) ensures the course content/learning platform stays current.

Annual certification should take approximately 60 minutes. After viewing each module, the exhibitor must successfully pass a quiz which demonstrates content mastery. Youth wishing to exhibit in the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows <u>must</u> provide his/her YQCA certification number when entering by the entry deadline on <u>June 6, 2018</u>. Youth who do not provide a YQCA certification number, or did not pass the YQCA modules for the current calendar year will not be eligible to participate in the 2018 Wisconsin State Fair Junior Shows.
