With the fair over and school beginning must mean it's time to gear up for another 4-H year!

Yes, that's right. Just when you think you are finished, it's time to get started all over again. The 2018-2019 4-H year will officially begin October 1st, but families are open to enroll in 4-HOnline beginning on September 5th. Now is the time to be thinking of friends and family who may not be part of 4-H and invite them to join. Think of all the wonderful opportunities you have had and wouldn't it be great to share those with others?

One of the best ways to encourage others to join 4-H is to celebrate National 4-H Week, October 7-13, 2018. There are a number of ways clubs or individuals can do this, including:

- Conduct a 4-H Find-a-Leader or Find-a-Member Campaign. Have each leader and member invite just one person to your next meeting to learn about 4-H, and your club would double in membership. For some clubs, it may mean the start of a new club!
- Participate in the 4-H Window Display Contest or ask to decorate a business window.
- Create 4-H displays at your local libraries or schools.
- Wear your 4-H shirt to school.
- Sponsor a poster contest with the theme, "4-H Grows Here", in your local school system for all youth, not just 4-H members.
- Ask if 4-H literature and bookmarks can be displayed at the main desk of businesses, libraries, or schools.
- Adopt a highway, lake, community building or outdoor area, or a local senior center.
- Participate in a community beautification project.

The possibilities are endless on how to celebrate National 4-H Week. It may be as simple as wearing a 4-H shirt during the week. Be proud of being a 4-H member or leader!

There will be a limited number of VIP Trainings November – February, so sign up early. These orientations will be held at the UW-Extension Office / Ag Center in Baldwin and Pre-registration is required. You can register by calling the UW-Extension Office 715-531-1938 or by emailing Heather at heather.vierling@ces.uwex.edu. Please provide your name, club, contact information and the date of the orientation program you wish to attend. Each orientation will last about 1 ½ hrs. In addition, volunteers are required to fill out 4HOnline enrollment information, acknowledge volunteer expectations, and complete a mandated reporter training online module. Background checks are conducted on new volunteers and repeat every four years for continuing volunteers. Any adults working with 4-H youth other than their own children must comply with these requirements.

Note: The room cost increases if there is more than one person. This is why the room rates are not half of the single room rate.

workshops to choose from. Top off the night with a special celebration where up to 10 people will be inducted into the Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame. Photography

The Fair is over, projects are put away, and record books are being worked on! I hope that everyone has good things to say about their Fair experiences this year and that everyone learned something new!!!

Congratulations to our Grand Champion MaKenna Miller, our Reserved Grand Champion Ava Lindley, and our Honorable Mention Maggie Brown. They will be able to have their photos entered into the Wisconsin State Photography Competition! Very exciting for them and for all of us!! Please make sure to email an 8 X 10 of your picture to Heather at the 4-H Office as soon as possible! You can include me on the email too!! Thank you!!!

The entries went well this year!!! Most members had the color versus the black & white/sepia choices done correctly. The two things that some struggled with is the 2 inch border and that the tag board needs to be white and there were a few regular entries that were framed. Always make sure to read over the rules/guidelines for all your projects.

One of the things the judges noticed, mostly because these three have judged now many times, is that the longer someone has been in the project the better their photos are becoming. This has not always been the case. There used to be a lot more beginner photos getting the blue ribbons and being up for Grand Champion. They strongly feel that those who have been attending meetings are gaining knowledge. When one member was asked why they didn't attend a meeting the response was, "I already know everything and the meetings can be boring," the judge responded with. "Then help by saving what you would like the meetings to be about and if you knew everything already then you should have all blue ribbons and be able to talk about your pictures better." This was a member that has been in the project for 5-6 years (they weren't sure). I am only putting this in here because one of the judges asked me to do so. The judges know that the mandatory meeting is being taken out of the requirements and they were concerned as St Croix County has really improved over the years. Another point that the judges wanted to point out is that there were very few black & white/sepia entries and some Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons weren't given out because of this!!!

OVERVIEW

GETTING STARTED

To get started with the re-enrollment process, log into 4HOnline with your family email and password.

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

RE-ENROLL

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2014-2015.

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. When you are done, click on **Continue**.

Next is the Additional Information screen when you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click **Continue** when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click **Continue** when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click **Continue** when done.

On the P ²⁰¹⁸⁻²⁰¹⁹ Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on **Edit** and select the volunteer type. Click on **Update** to save the change. Click on **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on **Edit** for that project and then click on **Delete**. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on **Submit Enrollment**.
