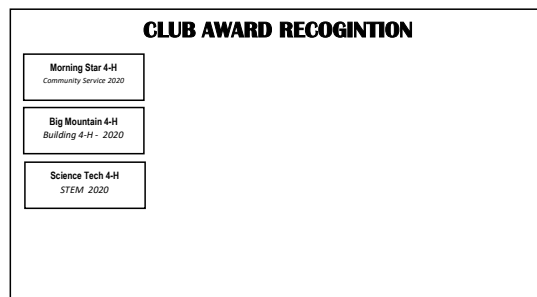

- Use a new award application —~~Based on the 4-H National Mission Mandates, (Citizenship, Healthy Living, Science).~~ Club stating their goal and then an explanation of how they accomplished the goal; listing specifics using examples, highlights, and photos. There are three different award categories. Each of the categories are broad based and encourages the clubs to focus on education, community and growing their clubs. The 4-H National Mandates were used as a guideline when coming up with the categories.
- Awards will be in the form of a permanent board with engraved plates added each year. This board would be displayed at the fair and hopefully hung at the extension office entry during the other months of the year.



- A certificate would be given to the winning club at the Leaders banquet.
- A sticker would be designed for each award category and a supply of the stickers would be given to the leader of the winning club. These stickers would be placed on the achievement certificate for each youth. The leader would determine what members would receive the sticker.
- Continue with using outside people as the judges for the awards
- Have the extension office order all awards

 - Member Disk
 - Club Award plates – placed on the Club Recognition board
 - Club Award certificates
 - Club Award stickers – given to leader to put on member achievement certificates
 - County member award plaques, ie Florence Jensen, Helen Holzer, Farm Bureau
 - Member achievement certificates
 - Outstanding Member awards, ie Dairy, Livestock -TJ Trophies out of Rice Lake (Cindy Croes)
