Dear 4-H Families,

I hope this newsletter finds you safe and healthy. I write this from home, sitting at what use to be my kitchen table and is now my office. How fast the world changes in just 30 days. During these difficult times I hope we take time to reflect on what's really important in life...our families. I am sure many of you are already stir crazy and with your kids home from school you are about ready to scream. I am always amazed at how youth deal with challenging times much better than adults do. Children are resilient when the world around us seems to be falling apart. But being resilient doesn't mean that they don't feel stress. Children may respond to stress in different ways



such as being more clingy, anxious, withdrawing, angry or agitated, bedwetting, etc. Below is a list of helpful tips from the World Heath Organization on how to help children cope with stress during this worldwide epidemic.

- Respond to your child's reactions in a supportive way, listen to their concerns and give them extra love, time, and attention.
- Remember to listen to your children, speak kindly and reassure them.
- If possible, make opportunities for the child to play and relax.
- Try and keep children close to their parents and family and avoid separating children and their caregivers to the extent possible. If separation occurs (e.g. hospitalization) ensure regular contact (e.g. via phone) and reassurance.
- Keep to regular routines and schedules as much as possible, or help create new ones in a new environment, including school / learning as well as time for safely playing and relaxing.
- Provide facts about what has happened, explain what is going on now and give them clear information about how to reduce their risk of being infected by the disease in words that they can understand depending on their age. This also includes providing information about what could happen in a reassuring way (e.g. a family member and/or the child may start not feeling well and may have to go to the hospital for some time so doctors can help them feel better).

Instead of bombarding you with emails I have tried to put an many updates in this newsletter as possible. Please note that things are changing on a daily basis and we will do our best to keep you informed. We currently are planning to return to regular 4-H programming on May 15 (note this may change). Please don't hesitate to reach out to myself and Eileen if you have questions or concerns. We are happy to help.

## 2020 4-H Scholarships, Key Award, and Forgivable Loan Application Deadline Extended to <u>May 1</u>

#### 2020 St. Croix County 4-H Scholarships

The St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Association will award more than \$4,500.00 in scholarships to outstanding St. Croix County 4-H youth pursuing higher education in 2020. Scholar-



ships are awarded to 4-Her's based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance, community engagement, and future educational goals. To be eligible, youth must have been a member of the St. Croix County 4-H program for at least the past 3 years, be a member in good standing, have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college, or technical school during the 2020 – 2021 academic school year. #### **Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan**

The Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan program is available to St. Croix County 4-H Youth. The loan provides youth with \$250.00 for study in the nursing field. The loan is renewable with a yearly application. To be eligible to receive the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan you must:

- Be a St. Croix County 4-Her or Alumni
- Have a current GPA minimum of 2.5
- Enter a field of nursing study
- Complete the proper application process
- Complete 2 4 years of nursing study or training. After graduation the recipient is required to submit a copy of the graduation certificate to the UW-Extension Office, upon which the loan will be forgiven.

A member may apply for both the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan and a St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Association Scholarship. Applications are due no later than May 1. For more information go to https://

#### 2020 4-H Key Awards



The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community.

To be eligible, candidates for this award must be at least in 9th grade or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

Selection is based on an evaluation of the candidate's total 4-H record (membership, projects, activities, leadership, personal development and county 4-H and community involvement.).

### University of Wisconsin Recommendation on 4-H Youth Livestock Project <u>& COVID-19</u>

#### **County Weigh-Ins**

The University of Wisconsin Division of Extension is **requiring** all 4-H Clubs and 4-H Groups that coordinate/lead livestock weigh-ins <u>to postpone</u> <u>or cancel</u> these activities effective immediately. Some counties have beef weigh-ins that should delay. In general, lamb weigh-ins are farther out on the calendar. Swine weigh-ins, in most cases, have been discontinued because of the introduction of the swine health rule. Fairgrounds have been closed to events, and livestock markets may be closed or will not entertain



that activity. Many livestock markets have made alternative modifications for producers in dropping off livestock with no interaction of workers with producers.

#### Fair animal tags

Fair animals need to be identified for several reasons, such as animal management and animal health. Counties needing to get tags to exhibitors should do so with minimal to no human-to-human interaction. Have exhibitors communicate how many tags are needed for their families. Have someone package these tags wearing rubber gloves. Identify packets and leave at an unmanned distribution area. Communicate with families where the tags are located and utilize a staggered schedule for pickup. (Ie: Last name – A-F at 10 a.m., G-P at 11 a.m. and so on.)

#### **Purchasing of animals**

Since this situation is fluid and uncertain at this time, it ultimately is a family decision whether they purchase animals this year. Families should use the same precautions as instructed by the CDC when purchasing animals minimizing human-to-human interaction and social distancing. Many livestock auctions or sales are now online, and arrangements to acquire animals could be delayed.

#### **Fairs and Auctions**

The current situation doesn't lend itself to make any announcements or comments on these events. We hope activities will resume soon. YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals)

YQCA instructor-led meetings (ILT) should be **postponed** and students should utilize the online modules. There will be information forthcoming on YQCA online modules.

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#### St. Croix County Livestock Program, E-Learning Initiative

Due to the recent shutdown in the state of Wisconsin, the St. Croix County Livestock Committee has implemented changes as to how we will hold our educational clinics.

Currently, the St. Croix County Livestock Committee will be working to generate e-learning opportunities for exhibitors to take instead of in-person clinics. As of now, here are links that will soon have educational videos linked to them. Please be patient as the committee and the state upload these videos! If you complete the form via GoogleDocs, you do not need to email Lori or Shelby, it will automatically send to us once submitted. Should you complete the form via Microsoft Word, you MUST email Lori and Shelby.

3) Print the Educational Verification Form and attach to your project check-off sheet to be submitted at the time of the fair.

#### **COOL for Youth Exhibitors Country of Origin Labeling (Sheep and Goats)**

Basic premise of COOL: this is a government USDA rule that provides consumers with information of where their food originated. It is another step to protect the American food supply, and give choices to consumers. This is not USDA required for swine but is for sheep and goats and the SCLC IS REQUIRING them for all species. Producers (youth exhibitors) need to provide documentation of the origin of their project animal. You do not need to bring additional information to the first weigh-in. (Remember, if you purchased your animals from out of state, you need to bring along the import data that is required by DATCP.) For more information on COOL visit: <u>http://www.ams.usda.gov</u>.

In light of the recent COVID-19 pandemic, the YQCA Board is announcing a 25% flash sale on the web based certification. Here is how to take advantage of this opportunity.

- Only offered during the month of April (April 1 April 30), YQCA will be offering a 25% discount on web-based trainings, making them \$9.
  - a. Those wishing to take part in the flash sale will need to purchase \$9 web-based training coupons from YQCA. Coupon order forms are attached to this message or may be obtained by emailing <u>sales@yqca.org</u>. THIS IS THE ONLY WAY TO RECEIVE THE DISCOUNTED PRICE.
  - b. Once the order form and proof of payment is received, coupons will be issued and returned to the purchaser within 3-5 business days.
  - c. Coupons MUST be put towards a web-based training in the month of April.
- Youth who have already paid for a YQCA instructor-led training (on a date that has not yet passed), may log into their account and cancel their registration.
  - a. If payment was received via credit card, their payment will be refunded.
  - b. If payment was received via coupon code, that coupon code will be active again. This coupon code does not expire and would be able to be used in future years.
  - c. To cancel a registered training
    - 1. Go to https://yqca.learngrow.io and login to the account.
    - Select the course you will have an option to "Cancel Registration". This will cancel the training and refund the payment/re-activate the coupon code.

We recognize those who have typically utilized the instructor-led training option may be unfamiliar with what users receive with their registration fee. We have identified those items below and ask that they be shared with instructors who are pointing their youth towards the web-based training.

- Each session purchased includes three modules a knowledge builder, a skills lab, and a quiz.
  - The knowledge builder is where content is delivered, the skills lab provides an opportunity to apply the content, and the quiz tests knowledge. To receive a certification, an 80% must be achieved on the 10-question quiz.
  - These modules, completed in their entirety, will provide 2-3 hours of an experience for users.
- Features of the online modules include:
  - Characters at each age level to guide youth through the course
  - Free navigation within the course so youth can spend as much or as little time on a
    particular topic based upon their personal needs
  - Variety of learning opportunities to accommodate various learning styles and modalities
  - Audio button on each slide so youth can listen to audio rather than read the on-screen text



Users may revisit modules anytime during their year of certification to repeat the modules
purchased for additional learning opportunities.

**DATCP—Show Animal Sales Following the 'Safer at Home' Order** 

## Among the questions: Are show pig sales, or other sales of animals intended for show, considered "essential" under the Safer at Home order?

No. While the emergency order did not list show animal sales, the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) has indicated that they are considered nonessential services. For more information, please visit the WEDC website at <u>https://wedc.org/essentialbusiness/</u>. The site includes a form for anyone who has additional questions about their business' designation. This will not alter the Division of Animal Health's activities regarding importation of animals, or the

requirements outlined in ATCP 10.

The Safer at Home order is in effect until 8 a.m. on Friday, April 24 or until a superseding order is issued.

#### WI State Fair DNA Procedures Update

With the 'Safer at Home' order in effect for the next 30 days we are temporarily updating our DNA procedures while we are working remotely from home.

We will continue to accept and fill orders for 840 ear tags and DNA envelopes for the 2020 Wisconsin State Fair; however the office will be closed for walk up sales. We anticipate being able to process these orders very timely but please be patient as we adapt to our new work space. One change being implemented: please do **NOT** return completed DNA samples to Wisconsin State Fair right now until we are back in the State Fair office to maintain an effective chain of command. Once we are back in the office we will let you know so may resume sending samples to State Fair.

If you mailed your DNA samples within the last few days, do not worry! We do have plans in place to accept and secure all incoming mail.

#### **4-H Animal Projects Subject to Premises ID Rules**

Even if it's only one horse or one chicken, 4-H members who raise and show livestock are subject to the rules about "premise registration." The Wisconsin Premises Registration Act requires anyone who keeps, houses, or co-mingles livestock to register their premises effective November 1, 2005. Those premises currently licensed by the Department must register as part of their annual license renewal date. Premises registration is not aimed solely at traditional large-scale agriculture. A premise may house many animals or a single animal. It doesn't matter if the animals are for sale or not. If they house any of the listed species, they are included:

#### Who must register?

- The property owner, livestock owner, livestock caretaker, or other person involved in the livestock operation must register facilities not licensed by DATCP. If two or more people keep livestock on the same premises, one registration covers all.
- Current DATCP licensees must register their licensed livestock premises (dairy, deer and fish farms; animal markets, dealers and truckers; slaughter and rendering plants; and equine quarantine facilities).

#### How to register?

- Register online: <u>www.wiid.org</u>, phone WLIC at 888-808-1910, or use paper forms available from DATCP or WLIC.
- DATCP will send renewals every three years.
- Information required: Legal name, trade name, address, phone.
- Primary premises & up to 3 secondary locations.
- Name & phone of contact person who has knowledge of livestock movements to and from premises.

Type of operation & Type of livestock.

Registrants will receive a unique premises registration number printed on a convenient plastic card, which can be carried in a wallet or placed in a file.

### Wisconsin 4-H Educational Travel Program Updates (as of 4/1/20)

Based on the current information, UW-Madison has decided to suspend all face-to-face classes and activities through the first week in May. This means that 4-H face-to-face gatherings of all kinds are suspended until at least May 3rd. Extension staff are working hard to strengthen and re-imagine programming; this is something that we typically do not have time to do. This information is for events run out of the State 4-H office. If an event is postponed/cancelled (or if an attendee is no longer able to attend the reschedule dates if an event is postponed), full refunds will be issued in most cases.
