UW-Extension COVID-19 Updates

Here are the latest guidelines from the University for 4-H members and leaders:

- Virtual and distance programs are preferred through fall.
- Face to face meetings of 10 people or less (indoors or outdoors) can be held with program approval.
- Face to face meetings of groups with 10 or more (not to exceed 50 people) may meet in outdoor or multi-room locations with program approval. Large groups must be broken down in to groups of 10 or less and remain separated and physically distant from each other.
- Overnight camps and travel programs continued to be cancelled.
- 4-H clubs and committees participation in local events, festivals, parades, or food stands is not allowed.

Lately, it seems like we've been inundated with national election materials, political signs and media coverage of the presidential race and issues at hand. This is an excellent opportunity to teach our youth about civic responsibility and to allow them to exercise their right to speak out and choose their elected officials.

Club officer elections provide youth with the opportunity to begin forming opinions about what they value. Club officer elections also help youth understand how to voice their concerns / questions and pick the right candidate for the job. It's important that everyone's voice is heard, even young people. By helping youth understand their voice in the election process, we will be empowering them within our community to help make decisions and giving their voice the value it deserves.

4-H club elections are a great training tool for youth. Below is a list of successful tools to help your club vote to create a great officer team,

- Have job descriptions for each position you are electing
- Have youth nominate individuals they feel would do well in the positions. Youth can also nominate themselves.
- Have nominees put together a resume for club members to review.
- Have nominees give a short speech / presentation to discuss why they are interested in the position and what skills and / or changes they will bring to the club in this position.
- Teach club members about voting (types of voting options...voice, hand, ballot)

Youth should be commended for stepping up into these advanced leadership positions. Club officers do a wonderful job of role modeling leadership skills to our younger members. Please do your best as an adult leader / parent to encourage youth to be on their club officer ballot this year.

4-H Club Financial Records Due September 1:

Club leaders and treasurers please be aware that the Club Financial Records are now due September 1. A couple of hints about using the fillable form:

- If you do not see the fillable boxes on the form on your browser, you will have to either open the form with a different internet browser or download the document.

To download the document:

1. a. Locate the download button on the top right of the screen (icon with a sheet of paper and a downward arrow) and click it.
2. b. Save the file as a PDF in an easy to find location.
3. c. Fill out the PDF completely (you will need Adobe Reader installed, it is available free to download online), and save it once you have completely filled it out.

Once you have saved the completed pdf, you should be able to attach and send it.

Final Charter document is due October 15:

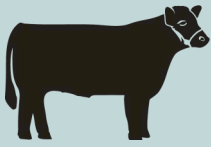

Nature Science — MIGRATION UNDERWAY: WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP

Breeding season has come to an end for most birds, while many are getting ready for or have already begun their migrations. Backyard feeders are busy with orioles and hummingbirds fueling up for their southward flights, some having already departed northern portions of the state. Finches, nuthatches, and woodpeckers remain, however, including above-average reports of purple finch, red-breasted nuthatch, and red-headed woodpecker. Seeing blue jays or northern cardinals without any head feathers? No need for alarm as this is normal feather molt (replacement) this time of year.

In the backyard, observers are reporting an increase in activity as young orioles, grosbeaks, finches, and woodpeckers come for a meal. Now is a great time to provide a water source and food for traveling birds. Many birds, such as catbirds, mockingbirds and robins, eat fruit and berries all summer long, while most other birds have a diet of insects and seeds. But strangely, lots of seed and insect eaters as well, start to crave a diet of fruit in preparation for migration. What can you do to help birds during fall migration? Offering nourishing fruits and berries, especially during late summer and fall months is one way you can help our migrating birds. Fruits and berries to offer can be apples, banana slices, blueberries, cherries, pears, strawberries and/or watermelon pieces, to name just a few. All of these fruits can be served on a platform feeder or a specific fruit feeder, often designed to keep the food fresh while giving birds easy access to the food.
