


Leader Re-Enrollment

- Shooting Sports Training (requirement for any volunteer wishing to assist with the shooting sports program)

Annual Charter Financials

In addition to the Charter document, you will need to complete the annual financial paperwork. This needs to be completed and turned into the Extension Office by <u>August 29</u>. You will receive these forms via email in the beginning of July. Please let Heather know if you have any questions. In addition to these forms you will also need to turn in:

- copies of all bank statements (July 1, 2021 June 30, 2022)
- copies of check book registers / Excel forms (whatever format you keep your books in)
- updated inventory list (if you have any additions from the prior year)
- If you have an annual income over \$20,000 you will also need to turn in your monthly treasurers' reports

For the second consecutive year, a partnership between Wisconsin 4-H and Tabur Kencana Nusantara provided



opportunities for over forty youth in Wisconsin and Indonesia to connect and learn from each other through the Spring 2022 Pen Pal Program. Participants were between the ages of 14 and 18 and represented twenty different counties and nearly a dozen islands in Indonesia.

Wisconsin participants were matched with an Indonesian participant based on age and self-identified interest. Participants wrote to their international counterparts throughout the duration of the program. Building upon the successes and feedback from the 2021 Wisconsin/Indonesia Pen Pal Program, six "Zoom Connect" sessions were held for all participants to have a chance to connect, learn from, and learn with one another. The first two sessions focused on language where Wisconsin participants were able to learn common greetings and phrases in Bahasa Indonesian, while Wisconsin participants taught popular American slang and phrases. The third and fourth sessions gave participants an opportunity to share an aspect of their own culture that is meaningful to and engage in discussion regarding the similarities and differences of schooling between Indonesia and the United States. Topics of particular interest were winter sports such as skiing and ice-fishing, experiences that the Indonesian youth were not too familiar with due to living in a tropical climate. During the final two sessions, Wisconsin participants had the opportunity to cook Perkedel, a type of potato croquette common in Indonesia, while a Wisconsin participant led everyone in making homemade caramel apples and caramel apple sundaes.
