NEW 2021 Summer COVID-19 Guidelines

Effective June 2, all fully vaccinated Wisconsin 4-H staff, volunteers and participants are no longer required to wear masks during programs. We ask that individuals who are not fully vaccinated, including youth under 12, continue to wear masks. Staff and volunteers will not enforce mask wearing or ask for proof of vaccination for those not wearing masks. Masks may still be worn if preferred and individual masking choices should not be interpreted as an indicator of vaccination status.

- Outdoors: Physical distancing is no longer required outdoors for vaccinated people. Individuals who are not vaccinated should maintain 6 feet of physical distancing and, if physical distancing is not possible, wear a face covering.
- Indoors: There are no group size limits on indoor gatherings as long as a minimum of 6 feet of physical distancing is able to be maintained, regardless of vaccination status.
- Transportation: Any individual who is not vaccinated should wear a face covering when driving or riding with others. Vehicle occupancy is recommended to be no more than 50 percent of capacity when traveling with an unvaccinated individual(s).

This updated policy applies to all Wisconsin 4-H programs including overnight programs, 4-H programs at county fairs and food stands.

As a reminder, Wisconsin 4-H staff, volunteers and participants should continue to follow local public health guidance.







- **Charter Document due 10/22** - This is the rest of the Charter document minus the financial report. This portion will be available for you to complete online. This will be posted to the website sometime in August.



Photography Project ~ July 2021

It's Fair Month!!!! Yay!!!!!! I do not have a lot to share with you now before the Fair!!!

*****There is going to be a Meeting on **Thursday, July 8** at the Agriculture & Education Center in Baldwin! (I always call this the 4-H Building J). **We will be meeting in the Big Room at 6:30!!!** The meeting will be about an hour/hour and a half!!

Please bring any pictures that you have ready for the Fair or if you have questions about them. They do not have to be on the Tag Board yet if you are not that far along!!! We will be going over the 5 Basic Rules and How to Present to the Judges. This meeting will be good for **ALL 1st and 2nd Year Photography Members and even 3rd Year as last year was not a judging year**. All others are welcomed to come if you have questions or want to go over things and even help out the newer members!!! There will be information in the Facebook Group also!!!!

Let us look at these in a little more depth!

- 1) The **rule of thirds** is dividing your frame into nine equal rectangles. You can do this by creating two vertical and two horizontal lines. The four lines will intersect at four points. These are the points where your point of interests should be.
- 2) **Leading lines** are **lines** that appear in a **photograph** that have been framed and positioned by the **photographer** to draw the viewer's eye towards a specific point of interest. (Think of a railroad track or a row of corn.)
- 3) The classic **close-up** is about **getting** detail. That usually **means getting** right into the subject. The feeling of 'closeness' usually **means** the shot is taken from less than meter away. However, **close-ups** can be as **close** as a few inches.
- 4) the **background** is the part of the overall scene. It's behind the main subject of the **photograph**. Proper design and use is crucial to photographic success. You need to be aware of what is behind or next to your subject and be ready to move a little to have a cleaner shot OR move your subject if possible.
- 5) **Framing** is exactly as it implies, seeing your image through something that frames it such as; a doorway, a window, through leaves of a tree, etc. **Framing** your subject within a another is a strong, graphical composition.


