
4-H Staffing Changes

Here is a poem that I came across that really stresses that point:

Advanced Space Academy

Start your engine and begin the countdown! We are preparing for an incredible journey into the world of Space, STEM, and Robotics. **January 21-27, 2023**, we will be offering a unique experience for youth to take part in: Advanced Space Academy.

This one-of-a-kind experience is open to youth grades 10th - 12th grade. Advanced Space Academy explores college and career preparation through an immersive experience in science, technology, engineering, and math. Trainees undergo a variety of astronaut training exercises, engineering challenges, and team building activities, all culminating in an extended duration simulated space mission. Activities include high/low ropes course, simulators, Russian language lessons, SCUBA diving instruction, fighter jet simulators, advanced rocketry, and more! Youth who participate will earn one credit hour of freshman level general science from the University of Alabama in Huntsville in this college accredited

program.

Advanced Space Academy is held at the National Space Center in Huntsville, AL. Participants will travel by airplane and stay the first evening in a hotel in Milwaukee, WI. During the program youth will be housed in dormitories at the Space Center. The total cost for all participants is \$1,650.00 / youth. Photography Project ~ July 2022


It's Fair Month!!!! Yay!!!!!! The Judging for the Photography has been changed and will take place on **Saturday**, **July 16 from 11:00 to 4:00**. Check your communicator for details on this!

Just in case you have questions about how to display your photos here are some tips on the guidelines! The most important things to remember are to use White Tagboard only and there are No Captions or Dates on the entry. Make sure there is a 2 inch boarder all the way around the photo. This is so your entry tag and ribbon fit on there without blocking your photo.

Here are the 5 Basic Rules of Photography that you should all know and if you have been in the project for more than 3 years you should be able to explain them to the judges! Here they are with an explanation.

- 1. The **rule of thirds** is dividing your frame into nine equal rectangles. You can do this by creating two vertical and two horizontal lines. The four lines will intersect at four points. These are the points where your point of interests should be.
- 2. **Leading lines** are **lines** that appear in a **photograph** that have been framed and positioned by the **photographer** to draw the viewer's eye towards a specific point of interest. (Think of a railroad track or a row of corn.)
- 3. The classic **close**-up is about **getting** detail. That usually **means getting** right into the subject. The feeling of 'closeness' usually **means** the shot is taken from less than meter away. However, **close**-ups can be as **close** as a few inches.
- 4. The **background** is the part of the overall scene. It's behind the main subject of the **photograph**. Proper design and use is crucial to photographic success. You need to be aware of what is behind or next to your subject and be ready to move a little to have a cleaner shot OR move your subject if possible.
- 5. **Framing** is exactly as it implies, seeing your image through something that frames it such as; a doorway, a window, through leaves of a tree, etc. **Framing** your subject within a another is a strong, graphical composition.

I will not be at the Fair this year. I did not know that they were changing the date of the Judging and we have a Wedding that day. This does make me sad as I will no longer be the St Croix County Photography Project Leader \sim I have given my notice. There was never one before I started in 2009 so I am sure you will be fine and there will be others that will help you out!

100 youth and adults from across Wisconsin gathered on the University of Wisconsin River Falls campus for the 4-H Spark Day. Youth engaged in workshops and tours that followed their sparks in agriculture and animal science, while experiencing the layout of a college campus.

UW River Falls professors and staff, 4-H Educators, and the Wisconsin Leadership Council lead workshop sessions ranging from animal reproduction where youth ultra-sounded a pregnant ewe, assessing plant health using technology, learning about the commodity market, the science of ice cream making (and tasting), weaving wool, and discussing careers.
