All new members must be enrolled in the St. Croix County 4-H Program by March 31 in order to be eligible to show at the St. Croix County Fair under the 4-H name. So do your best to keep recruiting new members or encouraging seasoned members to re-enroll.

In addition, current members have until March 31 to add or delete any projects. Click on "View" near the member's name on the "Family Member List" Screen. In the column on the left side of the screen, click on "Projects". There is now an "Edit" button on the projects page. Clicking on Edit will open a window similar to the add projects screen which was completed during enrollment. Be sure to ADD and Save changes. Dear 4-H Families,

It's been an awfully cold winter this year. I hope everyone is looking forward to spring.

One thing that 4-H is known for is its ability to be inclusive. Throughout the many aspects of our program, we make strides to ensure that youth and adults are included in the activities and projects that we do. To take the issue further, Extension and 4-H abide by Federal laws that relate to inclusion.

Based on the Federal laws, Extension does not discriminate against specific protected populations. Categories of prohibited discrimination include race, color, gender/sex, creed, disability, religion, national origin, ancestry, age, sexual orientation, pregnancy, marital or parental status, arrest or conviction record, or membership in the national guard, state defense force or any other reserve component of the military service.

We also are required to make reasonable efforts to have accommodations as stated in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act, persons who need materials in alternative format or other accommodations must write or call the UW-Extension contact person for the specific program or Extension Office at least ten working days prior to the event.

Finally, as a part of UW-Extension Civil Rights compliance, we are working to become more inclusive in our 4-H program. Making efforts to reach out and make contact with families who are not in our program currently is part of our role in the Civil Rights compliance process. In the future, you will see St. Croix County 4-H getting involved in more outreach to diverse populations and more promotion to those that we don't currently serve. If you have ideas on how to reach these populations, please contact us.

This is going to be an ongoing process, it won't happen overnight. We know that we already make a difference in the lives of youth, and there are many more youth that we aren't reaching. We appreciate your continued support and working relationships as we work to provide educational programs designed to empower the diverse citizens of St. Croix County, because 4-H can truly make a difference in the lives of all youth!

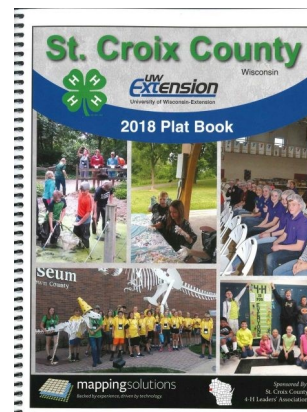

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Poultry Pullorum Testing Again Required for Fairs, Shows

The Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) is once again requiring pullorum-typhoid testing for birds exhibited at fairs and shows. In 2019, DATCP issued a waiver for testing requirements because the antigen used to conduct the test was not readily available. The waiver has been rescinded now that the antigen is once again readily available.

Testing for Individual Sales No Longer Required

Testing for individual sales, including swaps, is no longer required. This change was issued in the new waiver implemented in February 2021. For more information, visit DATCP's Poultry Flock Programs webpage.

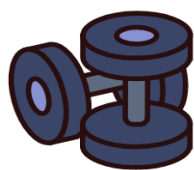

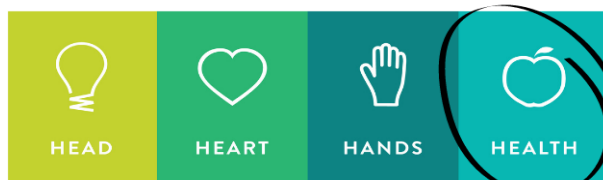

2021 4-H Scholarships, Key Award and Forgivable Loan Applications

The St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Association scholarships are awarded to 4-Her's based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance, community engagement, and future educational goals.

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Selection is based on an evaluation of the candidate's total 4-H record (membership, projects, activities, leadership, personal development and county 4-H and community involvement).

The Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan amount is \$250.00 for study in the area of nursing. The Forgivable Loan is awarded to 4-Her's based on demonstrated personal growth, development and leadership, academic performance, community engagement, and future educational goals. This loan is renewable with an annual application. A 4-H member may apply for both the Betty Jean Utecht Forgivable Loan and a St. Croix County 4-H Leaders Association Scholarship.

All applications must be uploaded no later than Friday, April 9, 2021 at 5:00pm. Late applications cannot be considered. The application requirements represent what youth may be asked to submit when applying for jobs. We encourage applicants to treat this process as if applying for employment. For help with creating cover letters and resumes, applicants should reach out to their club leaders, teachers or parents.

Youth sought to showcase their ‘Livestock Lessons’

Livestock Lessons is a new animal science experience for Wisconsin youth. Giving a Livestock Lesson is an opportunity for youth to share their learning with others and to teach others about animal sciences.

Great news! The next round of entries in the Livestock Lessons program are due on March 19, 2021. The potential topics for your lessons are endless! We would love for you to submit your 4-H demonstrations, FFA public speaking entries, any videos and written work that aligns with work you are already doing. This time period will allow us to see you talk about acquiring your animal project or caring for newborn animals. No matter what topic you choose, remember that the most impactful presentations are both accurate and engaging. Be creative, be funny, be serious, just be you! Think about something you have learned in your animal science project or something that you enjoy doing and prepare to share it.

Round 2 of the Wisconsin Livestock Lessons will include many ways for youth to show their work and interests.

For grades 3-8: (only one submission per category)

1. An oral video presentation.
2. Written Public Service Announcement (PSA).

For grades 9-13th: (only one submission per category)

1. An oral video presentation.
2. Written Public Service Announcement (PSA).
3. SAE Project Slides.

Livestock Lessons are open to all youth who are interested in the animal projects. Each youth can enter one submission in both oral presentation and written public service announcements. Entries will be divided into the following grade judging categories from the 2020-2021 school year: Junior (Grades 3-5); Intermediate (Grades 6-8); and Senior (Grades 9-13).

For older youth grades, 9-13, there is a new entry category: SAE Project Slides. The SAE Project Slides are to assist older youth in framing out topics of interest and exploring careers, which can assist them in completing their SAE application.

Each FFA Chapter that submits three or more SAE Project Entries will qualify for special recognition at the 2021 WAAE Professional Development Conference. The Wisconsin FFA Foundation will be supporting this new competition, with funds for qualifying chapters!

Submissions are due March 19. The top entries in each division will receive monetary awards and may be featured on Wisconsin Youth Livestock Program social media, YouTube channels and other media outlets.

Oral Video Presentations, Public Service Announcements (PSA), and SAE Google Slides must be submitted by March 19.
