

Chuck Kruschke Selected as North Central Region Outstanding Lifetime Salute to Excellence Volunteer for 2022! CONGRATULATIONS CHUCK!!!

Every year the National 4-H Council selects one outstanding volunteer from each region to receive the Outstanding Lifetime Salute to Excellence Volunteer Award. The Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award is given to an individual who has spent 10 or more years as a 4-H volunteer. This year, Chuck Kruschke, a long-time volunteer from St. Croix County, has been selected from the North Central Region for this prestigious honor.

Chuck is dedicated to the St. Croix 4-H Program as the Founder and current coach of the St. Croix County 4-H Dairy Judging Program, where Chuck has coached almost

1,000 St. Croix County youth, 19 district and state champion teams, and 1 National Champion Team in 1983. Along with the Dairy Judging Program, Chuck has been heavily involved in community 4-H programming for decades, having served as a St. Croix County 4-H Leader since 1970 and serving as a 4-H Leaders Council Member President in 1981 and Vice President in 1980.

In Chuck's nearly 52 years as a 4-H Leader, he has inspired thousands of youth and has been the recipient of several distinguished awards including the St. Croix County Living Memorial Award and the Wisconsin Holstein Association Distinguished Young Holstein Breeder Award.

As Tom Morris, colleague and friend of Chuck's, states, "Chuck's patient approach to coaching has developed skills well beyond dairy cattle judging. He has fostered teamwork, problem solving, decision making, and the ability to justify one's decisions."

As a recipient of the Outstanding Lifetime Salute to Excellence Volunteer Award, a plaque will be created in Chuck's honor and a \$200 donation will be given in his name to the St. Croix County 4-H Dairy Association. Chuck's outstanding service to 4-H and its youth is nothing short of an embodiment of 4-H values. The youth and future 4-H volunteers that he educates and inspires today will be our leaders of tomorrow.

In 1970, at the age of 18, Chuck Kruschke started the St. Croix County dairy judging team after being told that there was no talent or skill in northwestern Wisconsin. At the time, he had little experience coaching children and scant knowledge of the art of judging cattle, but 51 years later, Chuck has worked diligently to coach over 1,000 4-H youth! As many of today's young people don't grow up on farms, Chuck strives to give all youth access to the dairy industry. This outlook has allowed him to provide many 4-H'ers with opportunities they wouldn't have gotten otherwise. Chuck knows that he isn't alone when it comes to empowering youth - it takes a village of caring, dedicated adults who are willing to mentor and share their skills. He has brought in many dairy farmers and cattle enthusiasts to help work with 4-H member, offering them resource and connections within the industry. It is estimated that more than 40 adults have assisted with dairy judging over the years - many of them alumni of the program itself.

Chuck will tell you his greatest achievement as a coach is not having his judging teams win at district, state and national contests, but rather it has been helping 4-H youth develop poise, confidence and leadership abilities over time. This is something he has excelled at, as several youth have gone on to pursue careers within the dairy and agricultural industries as a result of Chuck's guidance and encouragement.



Requirements for attending a certification workshop:

- 1. Age 21 or older.
- 2. Be an approved 4-H leader in your county through 4-H Online.
- 3. Complete the National 4-H online training.
- 4. Register for your certification workshop of choice through 4-H Online.
- 5. Attend the complete 8 hours of the certification workshop.

Those reading the registration information on the 4-H Shooting Sports web page for Saturday certification workshops will notice there are different instructions depending on a leader's status. Leaders attending their first certification workshop have different instructions than those returning for an additional certification.

4-H Area Animal Science Days

Regional animal science educational opportunities are available to Wisconsin 4-H members. Specifically, Area Animal Science Days is a series of two day-long events held around the state in June where youth in the beef, dairy, horse, sheep, and swine projects increase their decision-making skills and knowledge of animals through judging and grading experiences. Events include evaluation of dairy cattle, horses, and meat animals; dairy showmanship contests; and oral reasons workshops. In addition, each site may offer a variety of workshops for small animal projects, which may include rabbits, poultry, dogs, cats, or llamas.

Philosophy & Purpose:

AASD Strives:

- To increase availability of educational opportunities in the 4-H Animal Science Projects
- To increase decision-making skills through judging and grading experiences
- To increase the knowledge of animals through breeding and market evaluation and management information

General Procedures:

- 1. Area Animal Science Days were started with the intention of giving as many young people as possible an opportunity to learn more about livestock and dairy evaluation. Area Animal Science Days evolved to broaden the scope of members enrolled in the 4-H Animal Science Projects.
- 2. These events are focused on the learning experience rather than the contest.
- 3. The 2022 Livestock & Dairy Judging contests are restricted to 4-H members
- 4. Activities and offerings may vary at each area site depending on the host county facilities and resources
- 5. Awards are presented to individuals and teams in Junior and Senior divisions. Divisions: Junior Age 8-13 as of January 1, 2022; Senior Age 14-18 as of January 1, 2022. WI 4-H members that are in the 13th grade and have reached their 19th birthday prior to January 1, 2022 are eligible to compete at the AASD contests and state contest as individuals but not as a member of a team. Youth must be in or completed 3rd grade, 8 year old Cloverbuds cannot participate.
- 6. We value inclusion and access for all participants. We are happy to provide accommodations for full participation in this event. Please contact Laura Pine at (608)262-1222 or lpine@wisc.edu by the registration deadline if you need an accommodation due to disability or a health condition.

Note: We highly encourage and expect livestock leaders and professionals will arrange for judging meetings prior to Area Animal Science Days. In those counties which eventually send teams to the State contests, there are many opportunities for judging workouts following Area Animal Science Days. We urge counties to involve as many young people as possible in this activity both prior to and during Area Animal Science Days.

Promote the Fair Contest Entries due June 26, 2022

Signs must be in place no later than end of day, Sunday, June 26, 2022 and remain up through July 24, 2022.

All 4-H Clubs, FFA, FHA and other organized youth groups in St. Croix County are invited to participate in the Promote the Fair Contest. Signs promoting the fair may be put up in any prominent indoor/outdoor location in St. Croix County. Be sure to get property owners permission! This is an opportunity for major Community Service as well as an outlet to display creative talents!

Prizes: 1st Place -\$125, 2nd- \$100, 3rd-\$75. Every road sign/road display will receive \$50 (up to two per organization), and posters will receive \$15 (one per organization), although each organization may put up an unlimited number of posters.

Any material may be used for the road sign, so be creative – the more creative and fun, the better it is to grab the passerby attention! The sign can be any size, keeping in mind bright colors and large print have the best visibility. The sign must be easily seen by the public as they are passing by and must be in a prominent location (intersections, lot corners, town entrances, building walls, etc.). Please make sure the sign is properly fastened and upright, making sure it won't get blown over.

The Rules are simple:

- 1. The display <u>MUST</u> include ALL of the following words: St. Croix County Fair; Glenwood City, WI; and Dates of the Fair.
- 2. Be in a prominent location
- 3. Any type of material or size
- 4. Be easily seen by the public.

Along with the Name of your club, a contact person, phone number, email, and exact direction to the location of your display must be sent, emailed or phoned in by June 26, 2022 to Cindy Croes, <u>ccroes88@gmail.com</u>; 651-470-1581

TIME TO ENTER THE ST CROIX COUNTY FAIR!!! Don't miss out - DEADLINE MAY 31ST - No exceptions!!!

To access FairEntry use the link on the Fair's website or <u>http://stcroixcofair.fairentry.com</u>. Use your 4-H online username and password to access your account. If you are having trouble, create a new fair entry account using the same username and password to get into the program. Your information should have integrated from 4-H online, if not simply add the required information--name, address, phone number, email address and parents name.

Entries are accepted April 1, 2022 to May 31, 2022--NO EXCEPTIONS AND NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

- •Pick the Department, then class and lots that you would like to enter.
- •We do not need a payment from you so skip that page and the next page will ask you to check your entries.
- •The last step is to submit, only after you are sure you have all your exhibits listed and everyone in your household that will be entering the fair has also picked their exhibits.
- •There are no changes to your exhibit list after May 31st, unless it is an animal health issue which you will need to clear with your animal species department head.
- •You will receive an email thanking you for registering for the fair. After your entries are approved by staff, you will receive a second email listing your exhibits. Forward that last email to your club leader so they can see that you have entered.

•Print that email so you have a paper copy of what you entered.

Animal changes will be allowed after that due to illness, by contacting your leader and the animal department leader. The Department leader will then contact Cindy to make the changes. Call Cindy with any questions: 715-246-5486 or email <u>cindyvandyk1976@gmail.com</u>

ATTENTION ANIMAL EXHIBITORS:

Remember when entering your animal for the fair to also enter showmanship if you are going to compete in that category. <u>It will not be able to be added</u> <u>after May 31st!</u>

Also market animals need to be entered in the carcass lot to be considered for carcass a carcass ribbon and premium. <u>This will also not be able to be added after May 31st.</u>

If you have already entered and did not enter the showmanship or carcass and your entry was not rejected for those reasons, email me and I will add them for you. <u>cindyvandyk1976@gmail.com</u> or let your livestock leader know and they can contact me. **Remember I need a grade level for showmanship.**

Don't miss out on the opportunity to learn more about our world as the **Spring Virtual Global Exploration Series** continues its "trip" around the world with upcoming session focusing on Malaysia! This program is designed for youth of all ages and their families. UW-Madison International Students and Reach Program Ambassadors will be sharing information about their home country, different aspects of their culture, and language!!! So far, we have explored three different countries and cultures.

Our first stop in India was led by Sourabh. He spoke about India's long history from the Indus Valley civilization to becoming the world's largest democracy today! Sourabh also shared about the Holi Festival, also known as the Festival of Color, in which festival-goers are covered in a colored powder that is thrown in the air!

Next was a trip to China led by Cecilia. She told us about the more than fifty ethnic groups present throughout China- and how the food and language also vary depending on which part you are in. We learned basic greetings including 你好 (nǐ hǎo) which means hello, 谢谢 (xièxiè) which means thank you, and 再见 (zàijiàn) which means goodbye, but we learned that just saying "bye-bye" was more common for younger generations. We also had fun comparing and contracting food in Wisconsin and China!

Our third stop took us to Kazakhstan to meet Alan. We learned that horses were first domesticated in Kazakhstan and that the first satellite and man into space both launched from presentday Kazakhstan. He shared about the many beautiful places and landscapes that can be seen throughout the world's ninth biggest country. In return, participants shared some of their favorite places in Wisconsin that they recommended Alan visit during his remaining years at UW-Madison.
