Below are new guidelines for 4-H clubs and groups for April 1—June 1, 2021.

ALL MEETINGS, EVENTS, WORKSHOPS, CAMPS, ETC still require you to submit a program approval form and get approval from county and/ or state.

Summer COVID guidelines will be posted in the June Communicator.

Indoor Meetings

- Up to 50 total participants or 30% of room occupancy (whichever is lower), podding for groups over 20
- For pods of 20 they can be in same space in large rooms (up to 30% of room occupancy)
- 4 hour time limit

Outdoor Meetings

- Up to 150 total, podding for groups over 20
- Program plans should state how pods will be separated
- No time limit

CREATIVITY!! Promote the Fair Contest Entries due June 27, 2021

All 4-H Clubs, FFA, FHA and other organized youth groups in St. Croix County are invited to participate in the Promote the Fair Sign Contest. This is a great opportunity for major Community Service as well as an



outlet to showcase and display creative talents while spreading the word about the St. Croix County Fair! Signs promoting the fair may be put up in any prominent indoor/outdoor location in the County. Be sure to get property owners permission!

Prizes: 1st Place -\$125, 2^{nd-} \$100, 3rd-\$75. Every road sign/road display will receive \$50 (up to two per organization), and posters will receive \$15 (one per organization), although each organization may put up an unlimited number of posters.

Signs must be in place no later than end of day, Sunday, June 27, 2021 and remain up through July 18, 2021.

Any material may be used for the road sign, so be creative! The sign can be any size, keeping in mind bright colors and large print have the best visibility. The sign must be easily seen by the public as they are passing by (most often in a vehicle at moderate speed) and must be in a prominent location (intersections, lot corners, town entrances, building walls, etc.).

The Rules are simple:

Tractor & Equipment Safety

WHAT: St. Croix County Agricultural Tractor/Equipment Safety Certification Class

WHEN: June 21, 22, 23, and 24th, 2021

TIME: Starting at 8 a.m. each morning and completed by 3:00 p.m. each day. Daily attendance is required.

WHERE: Baldwin High School Ag Ed Department Room 115

HOW: Complete a 28-hour class and pass both a written and driving test. This is a practical hands-on and academic week. Due to Covid-Masks required in the classroom.

WHO: All youth ages 12 & older working on any farm or business other than their parents. This is a Federal Employment Certificate for students 14 and older.

WHY: To become knowledgeable in operating Ag equipment. If you want to be able to drive a tractor on the road or for someone besides your parents you need to take this class. Farm Jobs, Nursery Jobs, anything with a tractor requires this permit.


COST: \$30.00 payable on June 21th for each student. This fee covers insurance, books, tractors, fuel, and facilities. (A minimum of five students to run the class) Schools sending four or more students without a participating instructor will be charged \$200 to cover the need to pay for a trained instructor. This is payable to: SCC FFA.

LUNCH: Students will need to pack a lunch daily to eat at the high school.

PERMISSION SLIPS: You <u>MUST</u> have parental permission slips signed and returned on Tuesday morning, June 22, to drive tractors. The slips are available on the first day of class.

TRANSPORTATION: You will need to set up transportation to Baldwin-Woodville High School on your own.
