UW-Extension COVID-19 Updates

Here are the latest guidelines from the University for 4-H members and leaders:

- Virtual and distance programs are preferred through fall / winter.
- <u>For Adult Only In Person Programming</u> (for groups of 10 or less)– A Program Approval Checklist and Participant Log still need to be submitted, but no state approvals are required.
- <u>For Youth In person Programming</u> A Program Approval Checklist requires approval before the event by the 4-H Educator. Participant log sheets must be submitted following the meeting.
- Face to face meetings of groups with 10 or more (not to exceed 50 people) may meet in outdoor or multi-room locations with program approval. Large groups must be broken down in to groups of 10 or less and remain separated and physically distant from each other.
- Overnight camps and travel programs continued to be cancelled.
- 4-H clubs and committees participation in local events, festivals, parades, or food stands is not allowed.

- Set up virtual bingo with the residence
- Have your club / family record a number of holiday songs and send the video for residents to view

Food / Clothing Drives:

• Set up a drop box at a families home or business



Adopt a Family:

• Have families independently shop for items, create a drop box of where the families can place their purchased items. Have one person / family deliver the items to the adoptive family.

Highway Cleanup:

• Club members must stay at least 6 feet away from each other while picking up trash

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

To develop these materials committees will:


- review current curriculum available for this project

Heritage Dairy Heifer Calf Applications Due: December 15







YQCA



Did you complete your YQCA in 2020? If the answer is yes, good news, you will not need to complete a new one to show at the 2021 St. Croix County Fair. The SCLC will be accepting your 2020 certification. If you did not complete the YQCA, you will need to complete the training prior to July 1,

Beef Weigh In/Registration

The 2020 beef weigh in will take place on Saturday, December 5, 2020 from 9:00-11:00. The inclement weather date will be December 12, 2020. The weigh in will look a little different this year. No animals will be weighed in...leave them all at home. You will come to the scale house. The first attendant will take your name, club, and animal information. The second attendant will give you your tags. You will need to tag your own animals. If you need help with tagging, please let the SCLC know.
