UW-Extension COVID-19 Updates

Here are the latest guidelines from the University for 4-H members and leaders:

- Virtual and distance programs are preferred through fall.
- <u>For Adult Only In Person Programming (for groups of 10 or</u> less)– A Program Approval Checklist and Participant Log still need to be submitted, but no approvals are required.
- <u>For Youth In person Programming</u> A Program Approval Checklist requires approval before the event by the 4-H Educator. Participant log sheets must be submitted following the meeting.
- Face to face meetings of groups with 10 or more (not to exceed 50 people) may meet in outdoor or multi-room locations with program approval. Large groups must be broken down in to groups of 10 or less and remain separated and physically distant from each other.
- Overnight camps and travel programs continued to be cancelled.
- 4-H clubs and committees participation in local events, festivals, parades, or food stands is not allowed.

Dear 4-H Families,

What is the 4-H motto? "To Make the Best Better" of course!

Throughout that time, 4-H has evolved and adapted to meet the needs of youth and families. 4-H isn't the same youth program it was 50 years ago, and you can imagine that it won't be the same youth program 50 years from now! 4-H changes to meet the needs of today's youth and families because it follows it's own motto.

Change isn't always easy for individuals or organizations, but it is imperative for us to consider changes if we want 4-H to be around in the future. Change doesn't always have to be HUGE it can be little steps which make the 4-H experience more inviting, welcoming, exciting, and relevant to today's families.

What are some ways that your 4-H club or group can continue to "Make the Best Better" and not only deal with inevitable changes but embrace them? Here are some ideas:

- Plan one meeting a year where members, leaders, and parents have an opportunity to provide feedback about what they like about their 4-H experience and what they would like to make better.
- Be open and respectful to new ideas when they are presented. Don't automatically ignore them because they are "different" from how things have always been done. At the very least, give the club or group an opportunity to discuss the pros and cons of implementing the suggested change.
- Go so far as to even <u>encourage</u> new ideas from members, leaders, and parents.
- If the club decides not to embrace a suggested idea for change, take the time to explain <u>why</u> the traditional way works better.
- If you are placed in a position of accepting a change you don't believe in, keep an open mind and stay positive. A positive attitude helps you feel good about yourself, goes a long way toward improving your health and helps you deal with changes that come along.

During 2020 change has entered our lives many times. 4-H has worked hard to adapt to these changing times, but can only continue to be successful if our members, leaders and families embrace these changes too. Change is hard and sometimes scary, but if we work together we can overcome it and "Make the Best Better".
