Dear 4-H Families,

Did you know that the full name of 4-H is 4-H Youth Development? Because we are all about youth development, we have core tenets that the program is built around. Often in 4-H, we use the educational tool of the "Essential Elements". If someone has all four essential elements, that person has what they need to flourish in their environment. The four elements are Belonging, Mastery, Independence, and Generosity. Each tenet builds upon the previous.

<u>Belonging</u> is the first thing someone should encounter when talking to a 4-H club for the first time. If you don't have a sense of belonging, what motivation would you have to join that club or group? Belonging can be as simple as introducing yourself to someone



or asking a person for their opinion. It creates value and a sense of worth.

Once you feel as though they fit into their environment, you will probably be more comfortable trying new things. <u>Mastery</u> implies that you are taking ownership of a skill that you learned and are becoming some sort of an expert at that skillset.

Deciding how to use the skills you've mastered creates a sense of *Independence*. Growing to a point where you can make decisions on your own, but also living with the consequences. Being independent also means occasionally making mistakes and learning from those mistakes. Regardless, you see that your independence makes an impact on the world around you.

This is where the final element of <u>Generosity</u> can be found. Your mastery of your skillset and your ability to operate those skills independently makes you more comfortable giving back to those around you. Whether that generosity is through a community service project or providing service to others, your impact on your community will reverberate because of the essential elements that are found in 4-H.

Everything we do in 4-H should embody the Essential Elements and the Circle of Courage. It is a tried and true way to help people grow to make a difference in the world we live.

Wisconsin State Fair Eligibility

Recently, the Wisconsin State Fair dropped the eligibility requirement for youth to be members of an organization in order to participate in the Youth Expo and Junior Exhibitions. However, county fairs <u>will continue to require</u> youth organization membership in 4-H and FFA to be eligible to exhibit at local fairs. County fairs will also still require educational programs participation via DATCAP rules and continued support and partnership with Wisconsin Fairs Association.

2021 Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2021. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Monday, March 15, 2021.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years, have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college, or technical school during the 2021 -2022 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

The application is a one page resume and a one page cover letter, both of which give the 4-H youth a chance to share their 4-H achievements, as well as their future plans. Applicants are asked to treat this process as if applying for a job. Cover letters and resumes must be submitted as one PDF document and emailed to <u>scholarships@wis4hfoundation.org</u>.
