CLUB INFORMATION

Welcome New Members and Families

Most of us probably remember being new to a group. We probably felt excited to experience new things and meet new people. Often, we felt nervous and worried because we did not completely understand what was going on. We want others to be a part of this great organization we call 4-H. The best way to go about this is for clubs to have a plan to welcome new members when they arrive at their first 4-H club meeting. If new members don't feel comfortable right away with the club, they won't come back.

Have a plan

Design a plan for welcoming new members. Delegate this task to a specific person called a New Family Coordinator (this could be a youth or adult leader), with this being their role at each monthly meeting. With 4-H, members can join at any time, so this is an ongoing task.

The First Meeting

When new members first attend a club meeting, be sure they are greeted and made to feel a part of the group by the New Family Coordinator. After they arrive and before the meeting begins, the New Family Coordinator takes the initiative of introducing themselves, welcomes the new family to the club and asks if they have any questions. The New Family Coordinator finds a spot for them to sit and sits with them for the meeting (incase questions arise). If a current family has invited the new family to the meeting, have the children sit with the current 4-H members and the parents with those that invited them. The New Family Coordinator should let the club president and secretary know there are guests present so that they can be introduced during the meeting after roll call has been taken.

Communication

Keep the lines of communication open, so that the new family feels comfortable it is important to ask questions. 4-H seems to have a language of its own and may need to be interpreted for the new family.

2023 4-H Camp Counselors Needed

Do you enjoy working with younger members in 4-H? Have you had experience planning activities for younger members? Have you worked with other members your age to organize group activities? If you answered yes to any of these questions, think about applying to be a 4-H Summer Camp Counselor. Serving as a 4-H Camp Counselor is one of the most fun leadership development opportunities you can be part of. Counselors (youth grades 8-12) will make up a team from three different counties and focus their skills to develop a great 2023 summer camp program for youth.

\rightarrow\$ How long does the survey take to complete?

The survey should take about 5-10 minutes to complete?

♦ Why should someone complete the survey?

To help inform us of how youth feel about their experience in 4-H such as their relationships with adult leaders, program offerings, and what they get out of the program. By completing the survey, you will help improve your local 4-H Program! You will also be taking part in the national 4-H Thriving survey which will help strengthen 4-H at the state and national level. As a bonus, youth who complete the survey will be entered to win prizes.

♦ Can I complete the survey on a paper form?

To help ensure that we are getting high quality data, all 2022 Thriving surveys will be completed digitally. If you would like assistance completing the survey, please reach out to your local 4-H Educator.

♦ Is the survey anonymous?

Yes. The educators do not know how respondents answered questions but will just see the results based on demographics including age, grade, gender, race, ethnicity, and club/ group. However, your email address is tied to a unique identifier, so participant responses can be tracked over time to see if there is improvement in program quality or outcomes.

♦ What happens to my survey responses?

Survey responses will be collected at the State 4-H office and shared out to your local Educator. The data will be communicated to stakeholders like elected officials, 4-H Program leadership, and 4-H members and leaders to help improve 4-H program quality.

♦ Who is being asked to complete the survey?

All members and participants of UW-Extension youth development programs, like 4-H and Youth in Governance, who are ages 13-19.

All re-enrolling 4-H volunteer leaders will need to comply with the following training requirements:

- Annually sign the 4-H Volunteer Expectations Form (part of re-enrollment through 4-HOnline)
- Federal background check (every 4 years) you can complete this online or via paper
- Mandated Reporter Training (all volunteers must complete this at least once)
- Title IX Reporting Training (all volunteers must complete this at least once)
- Supporting Youth Mental Health Training (all volunteers who are planning on being a 4-H chaperone)
- Shooting Sports Training (requirement for any volunteer wishing to assist with the shooting sports program)

As you plan out your club calendar take note of those activities that may require additional insurance. This insurance will cover all participants (youth/adult, 4-H and non 4-H). The cost is \$0.30/person/day.



James W. Crowley Dairy Leadership Award







4-H Meats Judging Contest

Mark your calendars for the upcoming State 4-H Meats Judging Contest on Saturday, February 4, 2023! If you have participated in the past or this is the first time you are hearing about the contest, we would love to have you join us for this day of learning, fun, and competition.

What is the 4-H Meats Judging Contest? Have you been to your local meat market or grocery store lately and think you could choose the best cut of meat out of the case? Have you ever watched a live

animal contest and thought you could choose what animals would provide the best meat products? This is your opportunity to put those skills to work. This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, and retail cut identification. Top teams earn the opportunity to compete at regional and national

Who can participate? You must be a currently enrolled WI 4-H member to participate in this contest. The age divisions are: Junior – Age 8-13 as of January 1, 2023; Senior – Age 14-18 as of January 1, 2023. WI 4-H members that are in the 13th grade and have reached their 19th birthday prior to January 1, 2023 are eligible to compete at this state contest as individuals but not as a member of a team. Youth must be in or completed 3rd grade, 8-year-old Cloverbuds

Even if your county has not participated in the past, round-up some 4-H friends and take advantage of this fun opportunity to show your knowledge of the animal species and industry.
