
The fair board approved the strawberry shortcake and brownies /cookies with ice cream and whipped cream. We will also be open on Saturday before the fair, with a modified menu.



Questions about Roadside clean-up? What you need to know: Any group organized for some special purpose or task can be a sponsor.

- Each group must provide one adult supervisor for every five or six volunteers.
- All volunteers must be at least 11 years of age or in the 6th grade. No other persons should be on the work site.

It is the last bullet point that makes this a difficult service project for 4-H clubs because the activity would exclude all members that do not meet the age requirements.


The Little Britches Dairy Show will take place at the 2023 St. Croix County Fair.





Promote the Fair Contest

Entries due June 25, 2023

Signs must be in place no later than end of day, Sunday, June 25, 2023 and remain up through July 23, 2023.

All 4-H Clubs, FFA, FHA and other organized youth groups in St. Croix County are invited to participate in the Promote the Fair Contest. Signs promoting the fair may be put up in any prominent indoor/outdoor location in St. Croix County. Be sure to get property owners permission! This is an opportunity for major Community Service as well as an outlet to display creative talents!

Prizes: 1st Place -\$125, 2nd-\$100, 3rd-\$75. Every road sign/road display will receive \$50 (up to two per organization), and posters will receive \$15 (one per organization), although each organization may put up an unlimited number of posters.

Any material may be used for the road sign, so be creative – the more creative and fun, the better it is to grab the passerby attention! The sign can be any size, keeping in mind bright colors and large print have the best visibility. The sign must be easily seen by the public as they are passing by and must be in a prominent location (intersections, lot corners, town entrances, building walls, etc.). Please make sure the sign is properly fastened and upright, making sure it won't get blown over.

The Rules are simple:

- 1. The display MUST include ALL of the following words: St. Croix County Fair; Glenwood City, WI; and Dates of the Fair, including year.
- 2. Be in a prominent location
- 3. Any type of material or size
- 4. Be easily seen by the public
- 5. Utilize theme of the Fair for better score

St. Croix County Fair Barn Quilt Contest

What is a barn quilt?



Wisconsin 4-H License Plates

The 4-H specialty license plate is now available through the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles. Bearing the 4-H Clover and the message "Empowering Our Youth", the plate offers the opportunity to show support of the 4-H program, as well as make a financial contribution. The sale of each license plate will include a monetary contribution to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation.

Half of the proceeds from every plate sale will go back to the county where the licensed vehicle is housed, and the other half will be used for state and regional 4-H programs. Counties with license plate sales will receive a disbursement from the Foundation on a yearly basis, with a check payable to the county's Leader's Association. The funds may be used to support the county 4-H program under the direction of the County Educator.

Vehicles that qualify for the 4-H license plate include:

- Automobiles
- Motor homes (annual registration only)
- Motor trucks
 - 4,500, 6,000 or 8,000 pounds gross weight including dual purpose farm and dual purpose motor home
 - 12,000 pounds gross weight farm truck

Persons requesting Wisconsin 4-H license plates will pay:

- The regular registration fee for the vehicle if the current plates expire within three months or the vehicles has no plates.
- \$15 issuance fee or an annual \$15 personalized plate fee, if requested.
- \$25 annual donation. The donation may be deductible.

4-H license plates may be personalized by paying a \$15 personalized plate fee each year in addition to the \$25 donation and regular annual registration fee. With each annual license plate renewal, 4-H supporters will pay the regular registration fee for non-personalized 4-H license plates and the \$25 donation.

DATCP Asks Poultry Owners to Maintain Strong Biosecurity

The ongoing spring migratory period for wild birds continues to bring an increased risk of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) to poultry flocks. During this time, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) recommends that poultry owners continue using the strongest biosecurity measures to protect their birds.

The best way to protect flocks from infection is through strong biosecurity practices that prevent virus introduction. All poultry owners — regardless of the size of the operation — must ensure that strict biosecurity practices are in place to prevent HPAI from infecting flocks. DATCP encourages all poultry producers to review and update their biosecurity plans. Those who do not have a biosecurity plan should work with their flock veterinarian to develop one that clearly addresses the risks for disease introduction specific to their operations. Biosecurity guides and other resources are available from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Defend the Flock Program. <a href="https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/ourfocus/animalhealth/animal-disease-information/avian/defend-the-flock-program/de



As the northerly wild bird migration continues over the next several weeks, DATCP also continues to recommend keeping your flocks confined when possible.

State law requires Wisconsin poultry and other livestock owners to register where their animals are kept. DATCP uses this information to rapidly respond to animal disease outbreaks to protect animal health, the food supply, public safety, and Wisconsin's agriculture economy. Registration is free and can be completed at wiid.org or by calling the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium at (888) 808-1910.

Poultry owners who recognize any abnormal increase in mortality or clinical signs of disease, including respiratory distress, drop in food or water intake, decreased egg production, and lethargy are asked to report it to DATCP at (800) 572-8981.
