Enrollment for our new 4-H year opens September 5, 2023!

- ♦ All youth grades K—13th are welcome to enroll in St. Croix County 4-H
- ◆Enrollment will be open from Sept. 5—Nov. 1 for all current 4-H members.
- ♦ All members must enroll in at least one 4-H project.
- ♦K—2nd graders are only eligible to enroll in the Cloverbud project
- ◆3rd grades may only take one animal project
- ◆New members can enroll anytime.
- ◆ December 1 is enrollment deadline for Large Animal projects to be eligible to show at the St. Croix County Fair under the 4-H name
- ◆March 1 is the enrollment deadline for all other projects to be eligible to show at the St. Croix County Fair under the 4-H name
- ◆March 15 is the deadline to add/delete projects

Leader Re-Enrollment - Updates for the Fall of 2023

All re-enrolling 4-H volunteer leaders will need to comply with the following training requirements:

- •Annually sign the 4-H Volunteer Expectations Form (part of re-enrollment through 4-HOnline)
- •Federal background check (every 4 years) sent from HireRight.
- •Mandated Reporter Training (Required at start of volunteer service, taken through 4H Online, no refresher required)
- •Updated Title IX Training includes 2 modules that are incorporated into he Building Safe Spaces training.
- •Building Safe Spaces (Volunteers who work with your are required to take initial training, and then participate in refreshers every 2 years)
- •Supporting Youth Mental Health Training (Volunteers who serve as overnight chaperones/adult advisors or custodial car roles are required to take the complete training once, then refreshers every 2 years)
- •Volunteers in Preparation VIP (Volunteers take this training one time, unless a break in service of 4 years or more)
- •Shooting Sports Training (requirement for any volunteer wishing to assist with the shooting sports program)

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT BEING A 4-H VOLUNTEER and VOTING MEMBER:



There have been a couple of questions about volunteering/enrollment and voting. I think it is easiest to put it simply. If you are not an enrolled, accepted volunteer or member on 4honline you are not an approved 4-H volunteer or member in St. Croix County 4-H for decision making. voting purposes or banking. Only enrolled accepted volunteers and youth are able to vote, hold officer positions, be on bank accounts and provide oversight of 4-H events.

For example, if Dug was an accepted enrolled volunteer last 4-H year and wants to continue this year. She has made it to 7 previous meetings this year and she would like to vote at tonight's meeting. However, she forgot to re-enroll on 4honline this 4-H year. **Can she vote? The answer is no.** She is not an enrolled accepted 4-H volunteer, she is a previous 4-H volunteer (ending on Aug. 31st of last 4-H year.) Only enrolled accepted 4-H volunteers are able to vote, hold officer positions, be on bank accounts and provide oversight of 4-H events.

How can Dug make sure she has the ability to vote?

Enroll in 4honline as a 4-H volunteer. Complete all necessary trainings for Dugs level of volunteerism (club, project, chaperone, etc.) Wait for official letter/email from UW-Madison with volunteer role description notice before voting, holding officer positions and providing oversight of 4-H events.

All 4-H programs and activities must be supervised by a <u>staff member</u> or an <u>approved 4-H volunteer</u>, 18 years of age or older, who has completed all the following steps: (some of these steps will be changing as of Jan. 2024, communicator will have more information coming soon.)

- Step 1: Enroll in <u>4-H Online</u> including agreeing to the <u>Division of Extension Volunteer Behavior</u> Expectations.
- Step 2: Complete Criminal Background Check* (information will be sent via email to all new potential volunteers once a person has enrolled)
- Step 3: Complete Volunteer Training Modules: can be completed in any order
 - ♦ Module 1: Complete UW Madison <u>Title IX Training</u>
 - ♦ Module 2: Complete UW System <u>Mandated Reporter Training</u>
 - ♦ Module 3: Complete Division of Extension Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) Training
 - ♦ Module 4 (for chaperones only): Volunteers serving as a chaperone will need to also complete the <u>Supporting Youth Mental Health Training</u>

*A background records check for arrest and conviction records will be completed every four years for continuing 4-H volunteer leader

I would suggest moving committee/club elections to October meetings to accommodate for lag time with enrollments.

2023-2024 4-H Charters

The 4-H Charter indicates that a 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the Wisconsin 4-H program. The University of Wisconsin-Madison, Division of Extension grants 4-H Charters which formally authorizes a Wisconsin 4-H Club or Group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, the 4-H Charter Application provides:

- Documentation of educational activities of the 4-H Club or Group/Committee needed for liability coverage for 4-H volunteers and members
- Program impact evaluation and educational planning
- Documentation of compliance by 4-H Clubs and Groups with EEO, ADA guidelines, and Civil Rights laws.




