Impacts in 2023

Engaged with 217 learners around nutrition education topics in a variety of settings, including early care and education centers, after school programs, and housing sites.

Partnered with 7 food pantries and 6 community partner organizations to build an emergency food network, reaching community members with printed food resource lists in English & Spanish to promote access to adequate food.

Worked with Somerset Community Food Pantry to establish a Safe and Healthy Food Pantry where the healthy choice is the easy choice.

Inspiring Collaborations



After years of partnering with YMCA youth programming, we developed a new a partnership with Camp St. Croix in 2023. Though not direct associated with the local YMCA, Camp St. Croix is a YMCA day camp that contains a small farm. Through this new partnership we brought youth from the YMCA to the camp farm for a series of lessons using the Teen Cuisine curriculum. Farm staff introduced the youth to where foods come from using their garden and livestock. FoodWIse staff then led nutrition and cooking sessions using farm products.

As one partner said, "What a cool experience for these young people..."



One youth participant reported, "I have made all the recipes at home for my family and they loved them."

Multi-level Program **Efforts**

Since 2017, Katie Bartko, FoodWlse Nutrition Coordinator, has maintained the St. Croix County Food Resource Directory. These directories provide guidance on local resources that support access to food to supplement policy, systems, and environment (PSE) work in the emergency food sector as well as direct education efforts.

After updating these resources twice a year and getting them translated into Spanish, Bartko emails them to a list of partners, prints copies, and posts it to the local UW-Madison Division of Extension websites. There were requests for over 400 printed copies from partners in the last year.

A phone call in the fall of 2023 highlighted the importance of this resource. A partner trying to help a local family find resources found the food resource directories on our website and called me to ask for more help. She said "I knew I could depend on FoodWIse. I knew I could talk to someone there and get information." And about the food resource directories, she said, "Resources by the county are so nice. Really nicely done."
