



News from the Sunnyside Shamrocks:



St. Croix County Shooting Sports Exhibitors,

The dates to lock in for the four practices starting at **9** AM include May 11th & 25th and June 15th & 29th. Remember that to be eligible to compete and have a recorded score, two practices must be completed prior to the competition date. July 13th is the official competition date, as in years past and instructor schedules permitting, we will allow exhibitors to compete on the last practice day assuming they have met their requirements. As always we are very fortunate to be able to hold these specialized events at the Willow River Rod and Gun Club (1041 WI-64, New Richmond, WI 54017).

St. Croix Shooting Sports will hold a **parent's meeting** on **April 8th at 6:30 PM** located at the Extension Office 1960 8th Avenue, Suite 140, Baldwin, WI 54002. This meeting is mandatory, prior to the first practice May 11th, for parents/ guardians with exhibitors who wish to participate in the St. Croix County 4H Shooting Sports Program. Update on Illness in Dairy Cattle from DATCP

An illness has been reported in dairy cows in Texas, Kansas, and New Mexico. Affected cows presented with decreased milk production, decreased feed consumption, and reduced rumen motility. The U.S. Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA APHIS), Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Centers for Disease Control (CDC) are investigating these cases.

Yesterday, USDA APHIS announced that tests collected from two dairy farms in Kansas and two dairy farms in Texas have tested positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI). Per their press release, "At this stage, there is no concern about the safety of the commercial milk supply or that this circumstance poses a risk to consumer health." At this time, Wisconsin has not made any changes to import requirements for cattle from Texas, Kansas, or New Mexico in response to these cases. Current import rules for cattle can be found on the DATCP: Cattle & Bison Movement webpage: https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs Services/
CattleBison.aspx It is important to check requirements prior to importing animals from any state, as requirements can change. Requirements such as official identification and certificates of veterinary inspection (CVIs) help ensure all cattle entering Wisconsin are healthy prior to import. Tuberculosis testing is required for cattle imported from Texas and Michigan. The DATCP Division of Animal Health encourages producers to practice good biosecurity, including isolating new additions to the herd for at least 7 - 10 days. If producers notice unusual clinical signs in their cattle, they are encouraged to work with their herd veterinarian. To report herds with unexplained symptoms, **veterinarians should contact DATCP at (608) 224-4872** (business hours) or (800) 943-0003 (after hours and weekends).

FAIR ENTRY IS NOW OPEN FOR ENTERING THE FAIR

To exhibit at the 2024 St. Croix County Fair, entry is April 1st - May 31st. There will be **NO** additions after May 31st. The only exception to this rule is for an animal illness, which you will have to clear with your species Department Head. If you are entering an animal and you don't enter Showmanship or Carcass Evaluation at this time you will not be able to participate in these areas. Enter on https://stcroixcofair.fairentry.com/Fair/SignIn/19594 using your 4-H online information.

Be sure to enter all your exhibits and finish the whole family before you press the submit button. Once you submit you can no longer add exhibits for anyone in your family. When you submit you will receive an email stating that you have entered the fair. After your exhibits are accepted you will receive a second email that lists all the exhibits for your family.


