

Transportation to and from Extension activities is the responsibility of the participant and/or their parents/guardians. Individuals who choose to carpool to/from Extension programs assume any and all associated risks.

In situations where transportation for youth is provided as part of the Extension program, authorized adults who are 21 years of age or older and are approved to drive as part of their roles must complete the UW-Madison Driver Authorization.

- 4-H volunteers must complete the UW-Madison Driver Authorization process (email Sky for form) and maintain approval status in order to drive personally owned or rented vehicles on University business when acting in their volunteer roles. **Please allow at least three weeks for Volunteer Driver Authorization to be approved.
- When driving youth as part of an Extension role, individuals who are not the youth's parent/guardian must adhere to the rule of three unless approved through Extension's one-on-one exception procedure and agreed to in writing by the youth program participant's parent/guardian in advance of the travel.
- Authorized adults who are transporting youth as part of their roles must follow Wisconsin Department of Transportation Child Safety Seat Laws. It is recommended that all unrelated youth program participants sit in the back seat, assuming the youth are all of similar ages.



Requirements for Attending an Adult Certification Workshop

- Volunteers planning to be shooting sports 4-H leaders and current 4-H leaders may attend.
- Those completing a certification workshop with pending 4-H leader status must not instruct 4-H youth until 4-H leader status is approved in the county.

Update on USDA Federal Order Related to HPAI (H5N1) in Cattle



Today, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued a Federal Order (<u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/sites/default/files/dairy-federal-order.pdf</u>) designed to reduce the risk of HPAI (H5N1) spreading among cattle and poultry. The Federal Order will be effective Monday, April 29, 2024 and requires:

- Mandatory testing for interstate movement of dairy cattle
- ⇒ These steps will be immediately required for lactating dairy cattle. USDA requirements for other classes of dairy cattle will be based on scientific factors concerning the virus and its evolving risk profile.
- Mandatory reporting of positive tests
- ⇒ Laboratories must report positive Influenza A nucleic acid detection diagnostic results (e.g. PCR or genetic sequencing) in livestock to USDA APHIS
- \Rightarrow Laboratories must report positive influenza A serology diagnostic results in livestock to USDA APHIS

In the press release about the order, USDA stated, "The novel movement of H5N1 between wild birds and dairy cows requires further testing and time to develop a critical understanding to support any future courses of action. This Federal Order is critical to increasing the information available for USDA. Requiring positive test reporting will help USDA better under this disease and testing before interstate movement will limit its spread."

USDA's National Veterinary Services Laboratories (NVSL) has confirmed the presence of HPAI (H5N1) in dairy herds in Idaho, Kansas, Michigan, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, South Dakota, and Texas. USDA is publishing additional guidance on the Federal Order in the coming days and DATCP will share that as it is available.

Additionally, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) released an update here <u>https://www.fda.gov/food/alerts-advisories-safety-information/updates-highly-pathogenic-avian-influenza-hpai</u> on the ongoing work to ensure continued effectiveness of the federal-state milk safety system. The FDA and USDA continue to emphasize that the commercial milk supply is safe because of the required diversion or destruction of milk from sick cows and the pasteurization process. Pasteurization has continuously proven to inactivate bacteria and viruses in milk.

DATCP is closely monitoring HPAI (H5N1) in dairy cattle with both state and federal counterparts. As a reminder, DATCP encourages producers that notice unusual clinical signs in their cattle to work with their herd veterinarian. To report herds with unexplained symptoms, **veterinarians should contact DATCP at (608) 224** -4872 (business hours) or (800) 943-0003 (after hours and weekends).
