Barn Quilts for Beginners (55 minutes)

Have you ever wanted to create a beautiful barn quilt of your own? Join us as we learn some basic tips to creating a barn quilt and leave with a mini version to take home. *Grades K-5 Class Limit: 10*

Build a Wooden Hydraulic Table Lift (55 minutes)

Learn the basics of hydraulics by constructing a wooden table lift using syringes, tubing, and wood. Participants will explore how hydraulic systems work and create a functional lift capable of raising and lowering a small platform. This hands-on project will demonstrate the power of fluid pressure and mechanical design in a practical application. *Grades 3-5 Class Limit: 10*

Cake Decorating for Beginners (55 minutes)


ADULT ADVISORS NEEDED!




James W. Crowley Dairy Leadership Award

What?

Approximately 50 Wisconsin 4-H Youth register annually to attend this citizenship and leadership program held in Washington, D.C. Through a series of participatory workshops, speakers, committee work, field trips and social events, participants learn the importance of social responsibility and what it means to be a civic leader.

Why?

- Only for 4-H'ers CWF is the only national program offered exclusively to 4-H members.
- More than monuments Our "focus" is lifelong civic engagement, with delegates leaving ready to address issues in their communities, more than a DC sightseeing trip.
- Diversity and friendship CWF offers a unique chance to exchange ideas and experiences with people from across the country.

Who?

- 10th-12th grade at time of selection. Minimum age 15 during the trip.
- Carry county approval throughout program. Check with your local office about scholarship opportunities.
- Delegates may only attend once as a youth.



How much?

- The total cost is approximately \$2,500.
- The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation sponsors a portion of the cost. And many county 4-H Youth Development programs provide partial local sponsorships
- The remaining amount is the responsibility of the delegate and his/her family.

About the Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame

The genesis for our Hall of Fame began with discussions about how UW– Madison Division of Extension 4-H Youth Development should celebrate our Centennial in 2014. Three broad themes came out of initial planning: we need to capitalize on this opportunity for the future; take pride in our accomplishments; and celebrate our past.

This Hall of Fame is established to recognize 4-H volunteers, financial supporters, staff, and pioneers who made major contributions to the 4-H movement at the local, state, and national levels. The candidates represent 4-H in the broadest sense – they may be 4-H volunteers, financial supporters, UW–Madison Division of Extension professionals, or staff employees who had an impact on the lives of children, their community, or state through significant contributions of time, energy, or financial resource to 4-H and its members. The names of some are very recognizable, as sites and buildings bear their names. Others, while not broadly known, have transformed the lives of children and families with whom they've worked and the communities in which they've lived. The Hall of Fame preserves Wisconsin's 4-H history and development while increasing awareness of the Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development program.


