2025 ST. CROIX COUNTY FAIR ENTRY

The 2025 St. Croix County Fair is fast approaching, "Making Memories since 1910" will be a great time on our fairgrounds. Please remember that to exhibit at the fair and showcase the projects you have been preparing, you must enter the fair between April 1st and May 31st. This entry process is done online at FairEntry.com or through your online 4H website. Your information should transfer from 4H online but if it doesn't it is easy to make a new account, but you will have to add all your information again.

Things to remember:

- Make sure that all your information is correct and make necessary changes as needed. Check name, address, phone, email, club and parents. This is important incase we need to contact you
- Enter **all** your exhibits before submitting, making sure you are using the correct departments for the project you have entered. Also remember Youth can only enter in Departments 1-33, Education Dept. 35 is for youth not enrolled in a county youth program and Adults can enter in appropriate Open and Senior Citizens Departments 108 -162
- **ENTER EVERYONE IN YOUR FAMILY BEFORE SUBMITTING.** If you enter the first person and submit, you will not be able to enter the rest without making a phone call to Cindy and waiting for her to open your entry.
- Your entries will be checked, and if there is a problem, sent back to you to fix the mistakes and you will have to submit again
- Once you submit, you will receive an email from FairEntry confirming that you have entered.
- When your entries have been approved, you will receive a second email with a list of confirmed entries. **PRINT THIS LIST SO YOU WILL HAVE A LIST OF YOUR ENTRIES (incase you forget) AND FORWARD THIS EMAIL TO YOUR GENERAL LEADER SO THEY WILL ALSO HAVE A LIST OF YOUR ENTRIES. This will prevent a phone call in July to ask what you have entered.**
- There will be no changes to entries after May 31st unless it involves an animal illness. All animal changes have to be approved by the species department head
- Entry tags will be available at the fair office in Glenwood City on Saturday, July 12, at 10 AM - 3 PM. There are no tags for Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats and Horses. All tags must be attached to projects before they can be judged
- Check judging schedules that will be posted closer to the fair. Animal Husbandry Education Lead Small Farm Animals—The Farm at YMCA Camp St. Croix



Background

YMCA Camp St. Croix has been providing exceptional outdoor program experiences since 1909. For more than 100 years, and on over 400 acres along the St. Croix Riverway, Camp St. Croix has established a tradition of youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility in all year-round programs. Just 20 minutes east of the Twin Cities, Camp St. Croix provides a convenient location for kids and adults alike to enjoy quality programming in a beautiful, natural setting.

The Farm at Camp St. Croix consists of the High Tunnels, Discovery Garden, Educational Barn, small farm animals in the summer, and year-round laying chickens. These pieces make The Farm at Camp St. Croix the first nearly year-round educational farm in the St. Croix Valley. We work hard to bring participants, families, and the community together through education in small farming, cooking and eating what we grow, sparking a shared interest in growing and cooking healthy food. We strive to do these things in a way that is sustainable for the environment and our bodies, as well as reproducible at home.

Job description

The Animal Husbandry Lead would work directly with and report to the Farm Director to gain experience in developing and delivering farm animal educational programming for Camp Participants at Camp St. Croix, DayCroix. The incumbent would be responsible for teaching classes and conveying educational materials to 4-14 year olds in the animal area during four separate class times/day, five days a week. The incumbent would also work with class groups to care for the animals, and teach campers how to spend time with them in meaningful and respectful ways. This would help participants to understand why farmers have animals, and where meat and other animal-based products are sourced.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Develop and deliver age appropriate educational programming around concepts of the use of farm animals for human use, companionship, consumption, help, etc.
- Care for the animals during the summer, both inside and outside of program time
- Rotationally graze animals across the pasture (sheep, egg layers, broilers)
- It is important that this person adheres to high aesthetic standards in the space, this will require mowing and extra maintenance outside of educational time
- Support other aspects of the farm including but not limited to the high tunnel, Discovery Garden, farm store, and Pizza Nights
